## HOUSE RESOLUTION

STRONGLY URGING THE UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF THE INTERIOR AND THE UNITED STATES CONGRESS TO PROVIDE ADDITIONAL FEDERAL AID AND SUPPORT TO THE STATE OF HAWAII FOR FINANCIAL, MEDICAL, AND OTHER FEDERAL ASSISTANCE FOR MIGRANTS COVERED BY THE COMPACT OF FREE ASSOCIATION.

1 2 3 4 5 6 7	WHEREAS, the United States entered into a Compact of Free Association (COFA) with the Federated States of Micronesia, the Republic of the Marshall Islands, and the Republic of Palau in 1983, which granted citizens of these nations the ability to freely enter the United States and have access to domestic social welfare programs; and
8	WHEREAS, under this Compact, COFA migrants are allowed to
9	freely enter the State of Hawaii and are granted access to
10	certain state services, such as education and health care; and
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12	WHEREAS, the United States Congress passed the Personal
13	Responsibility and Work Opportunities Reconciliation Act of 1996
14 15	(PRWORA), that makes needy persons from COFA nations ineligible from receiving federally funded financial and medical
15 16	assistance; and
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18	WHEREAS, when the PRWORA went into effect in 1997, Hawaii
19	continued to provide equivalent services for COFA migrants using
20	State funds; and
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22	WHEREAS, the cost to the State to provide various services
23	to COFA migrants continues to increase every year and strains the State's resources; and
24 25	the state's resources; and
23 26	WHEREAS, in 2014, it was estimated that the State spent
27	\$163 million on COFA migrants, and of that amount, 53 percent
28	was spent on education and 44 percent was spent on health and
29	social services; and



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1 WHEREAS, in 2017, Hawaii spent between \$30 and \$40 million 2 on healthcare costs alone, more than twice the approximately \$12 3 million the State receives in federal Compact Impact Assistance 4 funding; and

6 WHEREAS, if the PRWORA is amended to allow COFA migrants to 7 receive federally funded financial and medical assistance, the 8 State would not have to expend state funds to provide the 9 equivalent services, thus allowing more of the State's general 10 funds to be used for services and programs for which federal 11 funding is not available; and

13 WHEREAS, in addition to amending the PRWORA, the State 14 would likely see a decrease in cost if the United States 15 government provided much needed dialysis and chemotherapy 16 centers in Micronesia and all areas covered by the Compact; and

18 WHEREAS, the United States government must address the 19 issue of additional federal support for the State to continue 20 providing state services to COFA migrants arising from the 21 unique federally created relationship between the United States 22 and the COFA nations; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Thirtieth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2019, that the United States Department of the Interior and the Congress of the United States are strongly urged to provide additional federal aid and support to the State of Hawaii for financial, medical, and other federal assistance for the migrants covered by the Compact of Free Association; and 31

32 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the United States Department of 33 the Interior, Office of Insular Affairs, is strongly urged to 34 review the funding of the Compact Impact Assistance grant and to 35 make every effort to increase the amount of direct assistance 36 available to Hawaii to offset costs incurred by the State; and 37

38 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the United States Congress is 39 strongly urged to support federal legislation to amend the 40 PRWORA to render COFA migrants eligible to receive federally 41 funded financial and medical assistance; and



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1 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the United States Department of 2 the Interior is strongly urged to identify and secure other 3 forms of direct assistance to the State and COFA population in 4 the United States, including grants from other sources and 5 federal programs; and

7 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the United States Department of 8 the Interior is strongly urged to provide dialysis and 9 chemotherapy centers in Micronesia and in all areas within the 10 Compact to decrease health care costs in the State; and 11

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Resolution be transmitted to the President of the United States, the United States Secretary of the Interior, the Director of the Office of Insular Affairs, the Majority Leader of the United States Senate, the Speaker of the United States House of Representatives, and the members of Hawaii's congressional delegation.
