## HOUSE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THAT THE COMPTROLLER CONVENE A WORKING GROUP TO REVIEW AND RECOMMEND IMPROVEMENTS TO STATE FACILITIES TO MAXIMIZE HEALTH AND COGNITIVE FUNCTION.

WHEREAS, individuals who work in state facilities provide a 1 variety of crucial services to the people of Hawaii at the 2 expense of the taxpayer; and 3 4 WHEREAS, any use of taxpayer dollars should be maximized; 5 6 and 7 WHEREAS, a joint study conducted by Harvard University, the 8 9 State University of New York Upstate Medical University, and Syracuse University linked green office environments with higher 10 cognitive function scores; and 11 12 WHEREAS, the study found that people who work in well-13 ventilated offices with below-average levels of indoor 14 15 pollutants and carbon dioxide have significantly higher cognitive function scores in crucial areas such as responding to 16 17 a crisis or developing strategy than those who work in offices with typical levels; and 18 19 WHEREAS, the cognitive function scores of participants who 20 worked in green buildings were, on average, between sixty-one 21 percent and one hundred one percent higher than those who did 22 not work in green buildings; and 23 24 WHEREAS, these findings were consistent with years of prior 25 research demonstrating that improved indoor environmental 26 quality is associated with better health outcomes for workers; 27 and 28 29 WHEREAS, improving the health and development of state 30 workers is in the best interest of the State; now, therefore, 31

BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 1 2 Thirtieth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 3 2019, that the Comptroller is requested to convene a Healthy 4 Workplace Working Group, a task force, to review and recommend 5 improvements to state facilities that will maximize the health 6 and cognitive functions of individuals working inside the 7 facilities; and 8 9 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Healthy Workplace Working 10 Group shall consist of the following members or their designees: 11 12 (1)The Comptroller, who shall serve as chair of the 13 Working Group; 14 15 (2) Two members to be appointed by the Speaker of the 16 House of Representatives; 17 Two members to be appointed by the President of the 18 (3) 19 Senate; 20 21 (4) The Director of Commerce and Consumer Affairs; and 22 23 (5) The Chief Information Officer; and 24 25 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the chair of the Healthy Workplace Working Group shall invite a representative from the 26 United States Green Building Council and a representative from 27 the Honolulu Chapter of the American Institute of Architects to 28 29 participate in the Working Group; and 30 31 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the chair of the Healthy Workplace Working Group may invite other interested parties to 32 33 participate in the Working Group; and 34 35 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that members of the Healthy Workplace Working Group shall serve without compensation; and 36 37 38 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Healthy Workplace Working 39 Group is requested to submit a report of its findings and recommendations, including any proposed legislation, to the 40
