A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE SPOUSE AND CHILD ABUSE SPECIAL FUND.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Congress passed the Family First Prevention
- 2 Services Act of 2018 (Family First) as part of the Bipartisan
- 3 Budget Act of 2018, Public Law 115-123. Family First changes
- 4 the way states may spend and claim funds pursuant to Title IV-E
- 5 of the Social Security Act. Previously, Title IV-E funds could
- 6 only be used for foster care maintenance, adoption assistance,
- 7 kinship guardianship assistance, and related training and
- 8 administrative expenses.
- 9 Under Family First, states with an approved Title IV-E plan
- 10 now have the option to use Title IV-E funds for prevention
- 11 services that would allow children who have been abused or
- 12 neglected or are at risk of being abused or neglected to remain
- 13 with their parents or relatives. States can get reimbursed for
- 14 certain twelve-month periods of prevention services.
- 15 The department of human services seeks to retain Family
- 16 First federal reimbursements and all Title IV-E federal

- 1 reimbursements to secure a stable source of funding for child
- 2 abuse and neglect prevention, intervention, and other services.
- 3 Currently, the department of human services is not allowed
- 4 to retain reimbursements received for a prior fiscal year, and
- 5 instead is required to deposit these reimbursements into the
- 6 general fund. The department of human services returned
- 7 approximately \$4,068,161 to the general fund in state fiscal
- 8 year 2016-2017 and approximately \$6,736,894 to the general fund
- 9 in state fiscal year 2017-2018 in Title IV-E federal
- 10 reimbursements. The ability to retain Title IV-E federal
- 11 reimbursements will assist to stabilize funding for prevention
- 12 services; allow the State to maintain and develop its own
- 13 evidence based, child abuse and prevention and intervention
- 14 programs suited for Hawaii's diverse and unique communities; and
- 15 improve and increase the State's capacity to prevent, reduce,
- 16 and appropriately respond to the impacts of spousal and child
- 17 abuse in our community.
- 18 The purposes of this Act are to (1) amend section 346-7.5,
- 19 Hawaii Revised Statutes, to allow the spouse and child abuse
- 20 special fund to receive Title IV-E federal reimbursements
- 21 received in the fiscal year following the year in which the

- 1 Title IV-E funds were expended, to replace the term "account"
- 2 with "fund," and to delete the "department of human services"
- 3 from the title; (2) exempt the spouse and child abuse special
- 4 fund from the central service assessment set forth in section
- 5 36-27, Hawaii Revised Statutes; and (3) exempt the spouse and
- 6 child abuse special fund from the administrative expense
- 7 assessment set forth in section 36-30, Hawaii Revised Statutes.
- 8 SECTION 2. Section 36-27, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 9 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
- 10 "(a) Except as provided in this section, and
- 11 notwithstanding any other law to the contrary, from time to
- 12 time, the director of finance, for the purpose of defraying the
- 13 prorated estimate of central service expenses of government in
- 14 relation to all special funds, except the:
- 15 (1) Special out-of-school time instructional program fund
- under section 302A-1310;

- 19 (3) Special funds of the University of Hawaii;

- 4 SECTION 4. Section 346-7.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 5 amended to read as follows:
- 6 "§346-7.5 Spouse and child abuse special [account;
- 7 department of human services.] fund. (a) There is established
- 8 within the state treasury a special fund to be known as the
- 9 "spouse and child abuse special [account"] fund", and to be
- 10 administered and expended by the department of human services.
- 11 (b) The proceeds of the [account] special fund shall be
- 12 reserved for use by the department of human services for staff
- 13 programs, and grants or purchases of service, consistent with
- 14 chapters 42F and 103F, that support or provide spouse or child
- 15 abuse intervention or prevention as authorized by law. These
- 16 proceeds shall be used for new or existing programs and shall
- 17 not supplant any other funds previously allocated to these
- 18 programs. [The account shall be kept separate and apart from
- 19 all other funds in the treasury.
- 20 (c) The [account] special fund shall consist of fees
- 21 remitted pursuant to sections 338-14.5 and 572-5, income tax

- 1 remittances allocated under section 235-102.5, federal
- 2 reimbursements received through Title IV-E of the Social
- 3 Security Act received in the following fiscal year from which
- 4 the Title IV-E funds were expended, interest and investment
- 5 earnings, grants, donations, and contributions from private or
- 6 public sources. All realizations of the [account] special fund
- 7 shall be subject to the conditions specified in subsection (b).
- 8 (d) The department of human services [, in coordination
- 9 with the department of health, shall submit an annual report to
- 10 the legislature, prior to the convening of each regular session,
- 11 providing an accounting of the receipts of and expenditures from
- 12 the [account.] special fund.
- (e) All unencumbered and unexpended moneys in excess of
- 14 \$5,000,000 in the spouse and child abuse special fund shall
- 15 lapse to the credit of the general fund. Upon dissolution of
- 16 the spouse and child abuse special fund, any unencumbered moneys
- in the fund shall lapse to the general fund."
- 18 SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 19 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 20 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on January 1, 2050.

Report Title:

Spouse and Child Abuse Special Fund

Description:

Exempts the spouse and child abuse special fund from the central service assessment and administrative expense assessment. Amends the spouse and child abuse special fund to allow reimbursements of federal funds in the year following the fiscal year in which the Title IV-E funds were expended, to be deposited and expended for state-funded share of spouse or child abuse and neglect prevention, intervention, and other related services. (SB1231 HD1)
