A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HOME CARE AGENCIES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 The legislature finds that home care agencies SECTION 1.
- provide an important service to independent but elderly or 2
- vulnerable persons by providing home-based non-health care 3
- services that enable those persons to remain in their homes, 4
- 5 rather than be admitted into costly residential care homes or
- institutional care facilities. The legislature further finds 6
- that in order to safequard the health, safety, and welfare of 7
- those persons, the current licensure requirements for home care 8
- agencies by the department of health should be retained. 9
- Existing licensure requirements include background checks on 10
- home care operators and workers and provide minimum standards on 11
- 12 the provisions of home care services. The legislature notes
- that the current statutory requirement for licensure for home 13
- care agencies is set to be repealed on June 30, 2019. 14
- Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to permanently require 15
- home care agencies in Hawaii to be licensed by the department of 16
- 17 health.

- 3 by amending section 8 to read as follows:
- 4 "SECTION 8. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2009[7
- 5 and shall be repealed on June 30, 2019; provided that section
- 6 321 11 and 321 11.5(b), Hawaii Revised Statutes, and the
- 7 definition of "health care facility" in section 321 15.2, Hawaii
- 8 Revised Statutes, shall be reenacted in the form in which they
- 9 read on June 30, 2009]."
- 10 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 11 and stricken.
- 12 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on June 29, 2019.
