# SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REAFFIRMING THE USE OF THE TERM "DEAF-BLIND" BY THE STATE OF  
HAWAII AND THE COUNTIES.

1           WHEREAS, terminology and labeling of a particular community  
2 based on a common characteristic or interest can be quite  
3 specific and significant to the community's members; and  
4

5           WHEREAS, many individuals in Hawai'i and nationally have  
6 used the term "deaf-blind", written in lowercase with a hyphen  
7 between the words deaf and blind, to describe individuals who  
8 are deaf and blind; and  
9

10           WHEREAS, long-standing institutions such as the Helen  
11 Keller National Center for Deaf-Blind Youth and Adults and the  
12 National Center on Deaf-Blindness have and continue to use the  
13 term "deaf-blind", written in lowercase with a hyphen between  
14 the words deaf and blind, to describe the deaf and blind  
15 community; and  
16

17           WHEREAS, federal laws that define and refer to individuals  
18 who are deaf and blind use the term "deaf-blind" written in  
19 lowercase with a hyphen between the words deaf and blind; and  
20

21           WHEREAS, the Hawaii Administrative Rules, in section 11-  
22 218-3, define "person who is deaf-blind" as "any person who,  
23 with or without the assistance of hearing or visual aids, has  
24 both auditory and visual disabilities that interfere with  
25 communication", utilizing the term "deaf-blind" written in  
26 lowercase with a hyphen between the words deaf and blind; and

28           WHEREAS, Act 218, Session Laws of Hawaii 2013, session  
29 established a comprehensive service center for deaf, hard of  
30 hearing, and deaf-blind individuals in Hawai'i, with the term  
31 "deaf-blind" written in lowercase with a hyphen between the  
32 words deaf and blind; and

2 WHEREAS, some individuals and organizations have sought to  
3 use the term "DeafBlind" with no hyphen between the words deaf  
4 and blind and the first letter of each word capitalized; now,  
5 therefore,

7 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirtieth Legislature  
8 of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2019, the House of  
9 Representatives concurring, that the State, counties, and all  
10 entities that contract with the State or a county utilize the  
11 term "deaf-blind" with the term "deaf-blind" written in  
12 lowercase with a hyphen between the words deaf and blind; and

14 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this  
15 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Director of Health,  
16 Director of Human Services, Mayor of the City and County of  
17 Honolulu, Mayor of the County of Maui, Mayor of the County of  
18 Hawaii, Mayor of the County of Kauai, Executive Director of the  
19 Disability and Communication Access Board, and Executive  
20 Director of the Hawai'i Civil Rights Commission.
