SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE CITY AND COUNTY OF HONOLULU AND THE OFFICE OF
HAWAIIAN AFFAIRS TO FINALIZE MEMORANDUMS OF UNDERSTANDING
WITH THE AGRIBUSINESS DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION FOR PURPOSES
OF DIVERSIFYING SOURCES OF IRRIGATION.

1 WHEREAS, on September 1, 2016, the Governor set a goal to
2 double local food production by 2020; and
3

4 WHEREAS, the transition from pineapple and sugar cane to
5 diversified agriculture will require diverse sources of
6 irrigation; and
7

8 WHEREAS, the State has purchased thousands of acres of
9 former pineapple land in Central Oahu to increase local food
10 production; and
11

12 WHEREAS, many former pineapple lands do not have sufficient
13 irrigation infrastructure or water; and
14

15 WHEREAS, recycled water is a quality source for irrigating
16 agricultural lands and can be used for the irrigation of food
17 crops where the recycled water comes into contact with the
18 edible portion of the crop, including all root crops; and

20 WHEREAS, the State is working with the City and County of
21 Honolulu and the Office of Hawaiian Affairs to divert the
22 1,600,000 gallons of R-1 water from the Wahiawa Wastewater
23 Treatment Plant so local farmers have a diverse source of
24 irrigation; and

26 WHEREAS, the Agribusiness Development Corporation must
27 finalize a memorandum of understanding with the City and County
28 of Honolulu to divert the R-1 water from the Wahiawa Wastewater
29 Treatment Plant; and

1 WHEREAS, the Agribusiness Development Corporation must
2 finalize a memorandum of understanding with the Office of
3 Hawaiian Affairs to provide the Agribusiness Development
4 Corporation with an easement; and
5

6 WHEREAS, this would be the second project in the State to
7 utilize recycled water for agricultural uses; and
8

9 WHEREAS, currently, the treated R-1 water is being dumped
10 into the Wahiawa Reservoir; and
11

12 WHEREAS, the public perception of the Wahiawa Reservoir is
13 negative due to the effluent outfall from the Wahiawa Wastewater
14 Treatment Plant; and
15

16 WHEREAS, diverting recycled water from the Wahiawa
17 Wastewater Treatment Plant provides opportunities to revitalize
18 and reactivate areas in and around the Wahiawa Freshwater State
19 Recreation Area; and
20

21 WHEREAS, the Department of Land and Natural Resources State
22 Parks Division is developing a master plan to increase
23 activities and facilities at the Wahiawa Freshwater State
24 Recreation Area that include bass fishing tournaments, Frisbee
25 golf, park golf, and walking paths; and
26

27 WHEREAS, diverting the R-1 water to support local food
28 production and revitalize the Wahiawa Reservoir for activity
29 will create economic development for the town; and
30

31 WHEREAS, reusing recycled water is in the public interest,
32 health, safety, and general welfare of the State; now,
33 therefore,
34

35 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirtieth Legislature
36 of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2019, the House of
37 Representatives concurring, that the City and County of Honolulu
38 and the Office of Hawaiian Affairs are requested to finalize
39 memorandums of understanding with the Agribusiness Development
40 Corporation for purposes of diversifying sources of irrigation;

1 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City and County of Honolulu
2 is requested to finalize a memorandum of understanding with the
3 Agribusiness Development Corporation to divert R-1 water from
4 the Wahiawa Wastewater Treatment Plant; and

6 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Office of Hawaiian Affairs
7 is requested to finalize a memorandum of understanding with the
8 Agribusiness Development Corporation to provide the Agribusiness
9 Development Corporation with an easement; and
10

11 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this
12 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Governor,
13 Chairperson of the Board of Trustees of the Office of Hawaiian
14 Affairs, Executive Director of the Agribusiness Development
15 Corporation, Mayor of the City and County of Honolulu, and
16 Chairperson of the Honolulu City Council.
