No. 52 entitled:

"SENATE RESOLUTION ENCOURAGING THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION
AND OTHER AGENCY AND COMMUNITY STAKEHOLDERS TO CONTINUE
MEETING AS A WORKING GROUP FOR SEXUAL VIOLENCE PREVENTION
EDUCATION IN PUBLIC SCHOOLS,"

begs leave to report as follows:

The purpose and intent of this measure is to encourage the
Department of Education and other agency and community
stakeholders to continue meeting as a working group for sexual
violence prevention education in public schools.

Your Committee received testimony in support of this measure
from the Hawai'i State Commission on the Status of Women, Hawaii
State Teachers Association, The Sex Abuse Treatment Center, Hawaii
Youth Services Network, Parents and Children Together, O'ahu County
Democrats Legislative Priorities Committee, and one individual.

Your Committee finds that sexual violence remains a serious
and ongoing threat to the safety and health of children and young
people in the State. Your Committee further finds that in October
2018, the Department of Education established a working group to
collaborate with other stakeholders to review Hawaii public
schools' current prevention-oriented child sexual abuse programs
and resources and initiate recommendations to enhance integrated,
comprehensive, and sustained support to ensure the well-being of



our youth. This measure encourages the Department of Education and other agency and community stakeholders to continue the efforts of the working group for sexual violence prevention education in public schools.

As affirmed by the record of votes of the members of your Committee on Judiciary that is attached to this report, your Committee concurs with the intent and purpose of S.R. No. 52 and recommends its adoption.
