attorney general to seek injunctive relief and any other recovery

SB 258 RELATING TO LEAD-BASED PAINT. AEN/CPH, WAM

Status & Prohibits the use of lead-based paint on outdoor structures after 12/31/20. Directs the department of health to develop rules

developing an outdoor structure lead-based paint abatement plan providing for the safe maintenance of outdoor structures that already have lead-based paint and the safe removal of pre-

existing lead-based paint from outdoor structures.

SB 367 RELATING TO ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION. AEN/CPH, Prohibits food service businesses and stores from the sale, use, JDC/WAM Status & or distribution of polystyrene foam containers, expanded Testimony polystyrene food service products, plastic straws, and plastic bags. **SB 522** RELATING TO PLASTIC. AEN/CPH, Prohibits the use of plastic bottles, utensils, stirring sticks, JDC/WAM Status & polystyrene foam containers, and straws by state agencies by **Testimony** July 1, 2021, and by businesses selling food and beverages by July 1, 2022. Bans the distribution or sale of plastic bags after July 1, 2023. Bans the sale or distribution of single-use plastic beverage containers after July 1, 2025. Creates the plastic source reduction working group to make recommendations for eliminating single-use plastic packaging. Appropriates funds. Decision Making to follow, if time permits.
