RELATING TO INDUSTRIAL HEMP.

AGR, JUD, FIN

Authorizes the Department of Agriculture to establish the industrial hemp program. Repeals the industrial hemp special fund under section 141-41, HRS, when the industrial hemp pilot program is repealed on 6/30/2021. Authorizes the chairperson of the board of agriculture to submit to the United States Secretary of Agriculture a proposed state plan to monitor and regulate hemp production. Effective 7/1/2050.

SB 1351, SD1 (SSCR698) Status

### RELATING TO HEMP.

AGR, FIN

Authorizes the Department of Agriculture to allow temporary inspectors to perform industrial hemp inspections and to deposit fees from inspections by temporary inspectors into the certification services revolving fund. Authorizes the Department of Agriculture to adopt an alternative method of sampling industrial hemp plants. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD1)
