Requires the Department of Agriculture to create a dollar-for-dollar matching program for beneficiaries of the federal Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program to purchase Hawaii-grown produce. Appropriates funds. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2)	AGR, FIN
<u>SB 754, SD1</u> <u>(SSCR914)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO AGRICULTURE. Enacts produce safety rules in accordance with the federal Food and Drug Administration Standards for the Growing, Harvesting, Packing, and Holding of Produce for Human Consumption. (SD1)	AGR, FIN
<u>SB 753, SD2</u> <u>(SSCR1043)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO AQUACULTURE. Appropriates funds for operational expenses for revitalizing the aquaculture development program within DOA. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2)	AGR, FIN
<u>SB 895</u> <u>(SSCR816)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO AGRICULTURE. Extends the offense of false labeling of Hawaii-grown coffee to include roasted coffee.	AGR, CPC/JUD

Submit testimony in ONE of the following ways:


PAPER: 15 copies (including an original) to Room 441 in the State Capitol;
