an effective date pursuant to sections 514A-40 and 514A-41, HRS, to update their public reports without revising any of the associated documents and have their public reports and disclosure abstracts treated as non-expiring developer's public reports under part IV of

chapter 514B, HRS.

HB 1257 Status

RELATING TO CONDOMINIUMS.

CPC

Enables condominium associations to adopt rules and regulations that: require unit owners to prohibit smoking inside a condominium unit as

part of a lease agreement; and prohibit smoking on a lanai of a

condominium unit and in all common elements.
