<u>SB 203, HD1</u> (HSCR1523) <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO VACCINATIONS. Clarifies that pharmacists may perform certain vaccinations or immunizations and are required to maintain immunization records. (SB203 HD1)	HLT, CPC
<u>SB 777, SD1, HD1</u> (HSCR1309) <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO HEALTH CARE PROFESSIONALS. Clarifies the list of acceptable institutions or organizations that can approve the continuing education courses needed by naturopathic physicians for license renewal. (SB777 HD1)	HLT, CPC
<u>SB 541, SD1, HD1</u> (HSCR1410) <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO MEDICAL CANNABIS PRODUCTS. Simplifies the list of manufactured cannabis products that may be manufactured and distributed by dispensaries. Updates transdermal patches to department-approved transdermal devices in section 329D-10, Hawaii Revised Statutes, thereby including non-patch devices that deliver through the dermis. (SB541 HD1)	HLT, CPC
<u>SB 341, SD2, HD1</u> (HSCR1544) <u>Status</u>	RELATED TO THE PRACTICE OF BEHAVIOR ANALYSIS. Exempts certain teachers working in collaboration with a licensed behavior analyst or licensed psychologist from behavior analyst licensing requirements. Clarifies that the licensure exemption for registered behavior technicians applies to those working under the direction of a licensed behavior analyst or licensed psychologist. (SB341 HD1)	LHE/IAC, CPC
<u>SB 549, SD1, HD1</u> (HSCR1699) <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO HEALTHY BEVERAGES FOR CHILDREN. Requires restaurants that sell children's meals that include a beverage to make the default beverage a healthy beverage. (SB549 HD1)	HLT, CPC



<u>SB 638, SD1</u> <u>(HSCR1474)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO LIQUOR. Adds unlicensed sale of liquor and unlicensed manufacture of liquor as offenses for which property is subject to forfeiture and increases the grade of the offense of unlicensed sale of liquor to a class C felony. Amends definitions of "organized crime" and "racketeering activity" to include the unlicensed sale of liquor. (SD1)	JUD, CPC
<u>SB 770, SD1, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR1633)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO REAL ESTATE LICENSES. Requires a high school education or its equivalent as a condition for new applicants to obtain a license as a real estate broker or real estate salesperson. (SB770 HD1)	IAC, CPC
<u>SB 980, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR1540)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO EDUCATION. Defines, for the purpose of compulsory education, a private school to be an education institution that teaches kindergarten through grade twelve and that is licensed or accredited by specified licensing or accrediting organizations. (SB980 HD1)	LHE, CPC
<u>SB 1000, SD2, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR1514)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO ELECTRIC VEHICLES. Prohibits the issuance of building permits pursuant to an application initiated on or after January 1, 2020, for all new residential multi-family buildings that have ten or more parking stalls and new commercial buildings that have twenty or more parking stalls unless at least twenty per cent of the parking stalls are electric vehicle charger ready, subject to superseding county ordinances. (SB1000 HD1)	EEP/TRN, CPC

DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW

Persons wishing to offer comments should submit testimony at least 24 hours prior to the hearing. Testimony should indicate:

- Testifier's name with position/title and organization;
- The Committee(s) to which the comments are directed;
- The date and time of the hearing; and
- Measure number.

While every effort will be made to incorporate all testimony received, materials received on the day of the hearing or improperly identified or directed, may be distributed to the Committee after the hearing.

Submit testimony in ONE of the following ways:
