SB 106 RELATING TO DEFERRED DEPOSITS. **CPH** Reduces the maximum fee a check casher may charge under a Status & payday loan agreement for deferring the deposit of a check from **Testimony** fifteen per cent to seven per cent of the face value of the check. RELATING TO MONEY TRANSMITTERS. **CPH SB 806** Amends money transmitter licensure requirements by adding a Status & credit report and extending personal background history from **Testimony** five years to ten years, which will enable the division of financial institutions to join a compact of states that license money transmitters for purposes of efficiency and standardization. RELATING TO PROFESSIONAL AND VOCATIONAL CPH **SB 385** LICENSING. Status & Repeals defaults on student loans, student loan repayment **Testimony** contracts, and scholarship contracts as grounds for sanctioning professional and vocational licenses. **SB 774** RELATING TO PROFESSIONAL AND VOCATIONAL **CPH** LICENSING. Status & Prohibits a licensing authority from using rules to supersede **Testimony** requirements set forth in licensing laws and adopting rules that authorize an unlicensed individual to perform duties, activities, or functions that, if performed by another professional, would require licensure of that professional. RELATING TO OCULARISTS. **CPH SB 225** Specifies that a certified ocularist, certified by a nationally Status & recognized ocularistry certifying board, may perform duties **Testimony** within the scope of that certification. **SB 251** RELATING TO SPORTS MEDICINE. CPH Provides a limited exemption from state licensure requirements Status & to out-of-state physicians who accompany a sports team to a Testimony specific sporting event in Hawaii or are invited to provide services at a national sport training center, event, or competition

in Hawaii, if certain conditions are met.

RELATING TO REAL ESTATE LICENSES.
Requires a high school education or its equivalent as a condition for obtaining a license as a real estate broker or real estate salesperson.

RELATING TO HEALTH CARE PROFESSIONALS.
Clarifies the list of acceptable institutions or organizations that can meet the continuing education requirements needed by

RELATING TO PHARMACISTS PRESCRIBING AND DISPENSING OF OPIOID ANTAGONIST.
Clarifies the scope of practice of the pharmacist to authorize pharmacists to prescribe and dispense an opioid antagonist to patients, and family members and caregivers of opioid patients.

RELATING TO THE BOARD OF PHARMACY.

Allows the board of pharmacy to approve pilot and demonstration projects for innovative applications in the practice of pharmacy under certain circumstances.

SB 203

RELATING TO VACCINATIONS.

Clarifies that pharmacists may perform certain vaccinations or immunizations and are required to maintain immunization records.

SB 823

RELATING TO MOTOR VEHICLE REPAIRS.

Requires insurers to provide a choice to the insured consumer

of authorizing a repair provider to utilize a like kind and quality crash part or the original equipment manufacturer crash part. Specifies that an insured consumer who chooses the use of an original equipment manufacturer crash part that would affect the insured consumer's crash avoidance or safety systems shall not be required to pay the additional cost for repairs using that original equipment manufacturer crash part. Specifies that an insured consumer who chooses the use of an original equipment manufacturer crash part that would not affect the insured consumer's crash avoidance or safety systems shall pay the additional cost of the original equipment manufacturer crash part that is in excess of the equivalent like kind and quality crash part, unless original equipment manufacturer crash parts are required by the vehicle manufacturer's warranty or the use of a like kind and quality crash part would void an existing manufacturer's warranty or the insured consumer's vehicle lease agreement. Sunsets 7/1/2024.
