Repeals the definition of draft beer. Applies the same tax rate to all beer. (HB887 HD1)</p>  | <p>CPH, WAM</p> |
| <p><a href="#"><u>HB 546, HD2</u></a><br/> <a href="#"><u>(HSCR1108)</u></a><br/> <a href="#"><u>Status &amp; Testimony</u></a></p> | <p>RELATING TO INTOXICATING LIQUOR.<br/> Permits a small craft producer pub licensee to manufacture not more than 125,000 barrels of malt beverages on the licensee's premises per year. Allows brewpub licensees and small craft producer pub licensees to conduct certain activities at satellite locations. Clarifies the definition of "growler". Allows brewpub licensees and small craft producer pub licensees to obtain a direct shipper permit. (HB546 HD2)</p>  | <p>CPH</p>      |
