HB 761 Status

RELATING TO CONSUMER PROTECTION.

EDB, CPC/JUD,

FIN

Requires businesses to provide proof of purchase in electronic form. unless a consumer requests it in paper form. Specifies the penalties for

violations.

HB 1409 Status

RELATING TO SUSTAINABLE BUSINESS CORPORATIONS.

EDB, CPC, FIN

Requires sustainable business corporations to file annual benefit reports with DCCA. Authorizes DCCA to terminate sustainable business corporation status for noncompliance. Requires the Business Registration Division to post searchable information on sustainable

business corporations on its website.

HB 260 Status

RELATING TO CONSUMER PROTECTION.

EDB, CPC

Requires that food scales be located within 100 feet of self-serve food

items sold by weight.

HB 531 Status

RELATING TO ENTERPRISE TECHNOLOGY SERVICES.

EDB, FIN

Requires the Office of Enterprise Technology Services Chief Information Officer to update the state information technology

strategic plan every four years, with the first update to be completed in

advance of the 2021 regular session.

HB 532 <u>Status</u>

RELATING TO GOVERNMENT DATA.

EDB, FIN

Establishes a Chief Data Officer and Data Task Force to develop, implement, and manage statewide data set policies, procedures, and

standards. Appropriates moneys.

HB 539 Status

RELATED TO THE SMALL BUSINESS REGULATORY REVIEW

EDB, FIN

Appropriation for staffing, commissioner inter-island travel, and other related operating expenses associated with the small business

regulatory review board under the Department of Business, Economic

Development and Tourism.

RELATING TO FILM AND DIGITAL MEDIA INDUSTRY HB 540 EDB, FIN Status DEVELOPMENT. Allows greater flexibility in conditions placed on eligibility requirements for the motion picture, digital media, and film production income tax credit. Amends the amount of the total tax credit that may be claimed per qualified production. Amends the annual aggregate cap placed on the amount of the tax credits that may be claimed by qualified productions. RELATING TO HAWAII FILM STUDIOS. HB 645 EDB, FIN Amends the motion picture, digital media, and film production income <u>Status</u> tax credit, to include, as qualified production costs, post-production activities and services performed in Hawaii film studios. Applies to taxable years beginning after 12/31/2019. RELATING TO THE CHIEF DATA OFFICER. <u>HB 733</u> EDB, FIN Establishes the Chief Data Officer within the Office of Enterprise **Status** Technology Services to oversee and manage the sharing of state data sets. HB 760 RELATING TO CONSUMER PROTECTION. EDB, CPC Status Requires full-service restaurants to disclose their non-participation in national advertising campaigns that offer a promotion or discount at its entrance or storefront. RELATING TO CONSUMER PROTECTION. HB 1166 EDB, CPC/JUD Status Caps the service charges for a primary and secondary ticket seller. Requires website operators to guarantee refunds in certain circumstances and disclose that the website is not the primary ticket seller. Prohibits speculative tickets and the usage of bots. Makes conforming amendments. HB 1216 RELATING TO TAXATION. EDB, FIN Status Establishes an income tax credit for taxpayers who own and operate a business from their principal residence. HB 1229 RELATING TO FOOD SAFETY. EDB, FIN <u>Status</u> Appropriates funds to the Department of Business, Economic Development, and Tourism to provide education and support to local businesses regarding the Food and Drug Administration's industry guidance on colored sea salt. RELATING TO INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY. EDB, FIN HB 1593 Requires the Department of Budget and Finance, in consultation with Status the Department of Accounting and General Services and the Office of Enterprise Technology Services, to develop and procure a uniform financial database for use by all state agencies. Appropriates moneys. RELATING TO SHIP REPAIR INDUSTRY. HB 534 EDB, FIN **Status** Establishes the ship repair industry income tax credit for non-profit entities to offset costs incurred to construct and put into service purpose-built floating drydocks at Pearl Harbor for use by the United States Navy. Claims for the ship repair industry income tax credit can be made annually after the drydock is put into service and until the

credit is exhausted. Repeals the capital infrastructure tax credit.

HB 875 Status

RELATING TO THE INTERNATIONAL MOON BASE

EDB, FIN

ALLIANCE.

Promotes the space industry in Hawaii by creating an International Moon Base Alliance to provide recommendations and guidance for the establishment of a prototype moon base on the island of Hawaii.

DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW
