<u>HB 556</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO ENERGY EFFICIENCY. Requires the Department of Business, Economic Development, and Tourism to adopt state appliance efficiency standards.	EEP/EDB, CPC
<u>HB 1015</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO ENERGY DATA. Permits the Department of Business, Economic Development, and Tourism to share energy data with the Department of Health for purposes of regulating greenhouse gas emissions.	EEP/EDB, FIN
<u>HB 630</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO GLASS CONTAINER RECOVERY. Repeals the Glass Container Recovery Program.	EEP/EDB, FIN

DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW

- The date and time of the hearing; and
- Measure number.

While every effort will be made to incorporate all testimony received, materials received on the day of the hearing or improperly identified or directed, may be distributed to the Committee after the hearing.

Submit testimony in ONE of the following ways:


