## RELATING TO PLANNING.

Status

Requires the State and counties to incorporate predictions of sea level rise and other climate change hazards and mitigation opportunities into applicable plans, strategies, and mapping. Requires the Public Utilities Commission, and any public utility regulated by the Public Utilities Commission, to consider the findings in the Hawaii Sea Level Rise Vulnerability and Adaptation Report. Encourages each county to participate in the community rating system developed by the National Flood Insurance Program. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2)

SB 77, SD3 (SSCR895)

RELATING TO CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS.

EEP/WLH, FIN

Status

Establishes two financing options for the State to select from to satisfy the federal requirement that thirty-five percent of Ala Wai Flood Risk Management Project costs be funded by a local entity. The first is a financing agreement that does not obligate the State beyond funds appropriated by the Legislature and the second is an appropriation of

general funds. Takes effect 7/1/2050. (SD3)

SB 934, SD1 (SSCR1158) Status

RELATING TO CONSERVATION DISTRICTS.

Prohibits any waste or disposal facility from being located in a

conservation district. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD1)
