HB 550

RELATING TO RENEWABLE ENERGY.

EEP, CPC, FIN

Status

Amends the definition of "renewable portfolio standard" to more accurately reflect the percentage of renewable energy use in the State. Establishes renewable portfolio standards and targets for gas utility companies that are similar to those set for electric utility companies.

HB 563 Status RELATING TO A COAL-FREE HAWAII.

EEP, CPC, FIN

Prohibits the issuance of covered source air permits for coal-burning electricity generation facilities after 2022. Prohibits the approval of a new, modified, or renewed power purchase agreement for electricity

generated from coal.

HB 72 Status RELATING TO MICROGRID CERTIFICATES OF PUBLIC CONVENIENCE AND NECESSITY.

EEP, CPC, FIN

Allows microgrid owners and operators to file for a certificate of

public convenience and necessity.

HB 298 Status RELATING TO INTRA-GOVERNMENTAL WHEELING.

EEP, CPC, FIN

Authorizes any government agency to engage in the wheeling of electricity that is produced at its own facilities from renewable energy resources, subject to disallowance by the Public Utilities Commission.

HB 560 Status RELATING TO ENERGY TRAINING.

EEP, LHE, FIN

Requires UH community colleges to establish energy systems and technology training courses for county officers and employees responsible for permitting, inspecting, licensing, and approving construction projects and an advisory committee of industry stakeholders and to submit a report to the Legislature. Appropriates

funds.

RELATING TO ENERGY EFFICIENCY. HB 557 EEP, JUD Amends the criteria for granting a solar water heater system variance. Status Authorizes the Director of DBEDT to impose penalties and fines for false statements on variance applications. HB 562 RELATING TO CONSTRUCTION WASTE. EEP, CPC, FIN Requires the Hawaii state building codes to incorporate the Status international green construction code. Sets specific targets for the recycling, reuse, donation, and resale of non-hazardous construction waste. RELATING TO ELECTRIC VEHICLES. HB 238 EEP, TRN, FIN Status Extends the sunset date for Act 168, Session Laws of Hawaii 2012, authorizing certain incentives and actions by the Department of Transportation regarding electric vehicles. HB 239 RELATING TO FUEL CELL ELECTRIC VEHICLES. EEP, TRN, FIN Status Exempts fuel cell electric vehicle from payment of parking fees and

Exempts fuel cell electric vehicle from payment of parking fees and high occupancy vehicle lane restrictions. Increases the priority to be placed on fuel cell electric vehicles for state and county entities purchasing new vehicles. Allows for fuel cell electric vehicles to be parked in designated electric vehicle parking spaces. For purposes of determining electric vehicle parking spaces, restricts electric system charging systems to those that do not include facilities or systems for refueling hydrogen storage tanks of fuel cell electric vehicles.
