HB 953

RELATING TO ENERGY ASSURANCE.

EEP, CPC, FIN

**Status** 

Addresses deficiencies in Hawaii's fuel shortage response and energy emergency (energy assurance) statutes; provides policy guidance on preparing for, responding to, recovering from, and mitigating against any actual or potential energy supply disruption or shortage to preserve the State's energy security and to ensure that fuel products and energy resources are made available to emergency services and the public in

an orderly, efficient, and safe manner.

HB 1520 Status

RELATING TO ENERGY EFFICIENCY.

EEP, CPC, FIN

Requires energy consumption benchmarking for all nonresidential buildings. Requires disclosure of resulting benchmarking data to a

prospective property buyer, lessee, or lender.

HB 201 **Status** 

RELATING TO INVASIVE SPECIES.

EEP, JUD

Clarifies that state, county, and authorized agents' authority to enter private property to control and eradicate invasive species also applies when there is a reasonable suspicion that invasive species are present

on that property.

HB 1085 Status

RELATING TO THE DEPOSIT BEVERAGE CONTAINER PROGRAM.

EEP, CPC, FIN

Authorizes each county to manage the deposit beverage container program within its jurisdiction. Authorizes each county to retain any corresponding excess funds. Requires deposit beverage distributor

reports to include county specific data.
