Amends the definitions of "dependent-beneficiary" and "employee-beneficiary" as used in the Hawaii Employer-Union Health Benefits Trust Fund, chapter 87A, Hawaii Revised Statutes. Clarifies the eligibilities of surviving children to receive benefits. Updates references related to marriage to account for civil unions in interpreting who is a "dependent-beneficiary" and "employee-beneficiary".	LAB, FIN
<u>SB 1498, SD1, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR1549)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE HAWAII LABOR RELATIONS BOARD. Requires the Hawaii Labor Relations Board to determine qualifications for grievance arbitrators. Requires the Hawaii Labor Relations Board to resolve the disputes over the qualifications and criteria for potential arbitrators selected under certain circumstances to resolve collective bargaining impasses. <u>SB 1475, SD1, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR1494)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO WAGES. Determines the procedures for when the foreperson classification shall be recognized in Hawaii's Davis-Bacon Act and the requirements in the collective bargaining agreement be followed when the basic hourly rate is established by a collective bargaining agreement. <u>SB 1213, SD1, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR1495)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO PROCUREMENT FILING FEE. Requires a party initiating a bid challenge to pay the Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs a non-refundable filing fee for contracts with an estimated value of \$500,000 or more.	LAB, FIN
<u>SB 812, SD1, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR1693)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE AND CONSUMER AFFAIRS. Establishes the operating budget for certain programs of the Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs. Clarifies calculation of Cable Operators' annual fee. Establishes or amends certain special fund ceilings and provides for suspension or refund of fees if the ceiling is exceeded.	IAC, FIN
<u>SB 823, SD1, HD2</u> <u>(HSCR1662)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO MOTOR VEHICLE REPAIRS. Requires insurers to clearly give consumers notice of the choice of whether to use an aftermarket part, if available, or an original equipment manufacturer part for motor vehicle body repair work. <u>SB 817, SD2, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR1510)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO SELF-SERVICE STORAGE. Authorizes the sale of stored property insurance by self-service storage facility owners under certain conditions. Requires self-service storage facility owners to hold a limited lines license in order to sell, solicit, or offer coverage under a stored property insurance policy.	IAC, CPC, FIN
<u>SB 385, SD1, HD2</u> <u>(HSCR1595)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO PROFESSIONAL AND VOCATIONAL LICENSING. Repeals defaults on student loans, student loan repayment contracts, and scholarship contracts as grounds for denying professional and vocational licenses and sanctioning professional and vocational licensees.	IAC, CPC, FIN
<u>SB 1091, SD2, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR1631)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION. Makes an emergency appropriation to the Department of Transportation to mitigate landslide damages and install rockfall protection structures on the Pali Highway and Honoapiilani Highway.	TRN, FIN
<u>SB 1378, SD1, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR1586)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO TRANSPORTATION. Clarifies that owners of chassis used for transporting shipping containers are exempt from the requirement to keep a certificate of registration within the chassis. Authorizes these businesses to keep the original certificate of registration, motor vehicle identification card, certificate of insurance, and certificate of inspection at their principal place of business within the State and specifies that it is not a requirement to keep the original or copy of these documents on the chassis. <u>SB 411, SD2, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR1445)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO TRANSPORTATION. Exempts marine terminal equipment temporarily moving in or between marine terminals at Hilo Harbor, Kawaihae Harbor, Kahului Harbor, and Nawiliwili Harbor from inspection, registration, and licensing requirements.	TRN, FIN
<u>SB 409, SD2, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR1446)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO ELECTRIC VEHICLES. Establishes an annual vehicle registration surcharge fee for electric vehicles and alternative fuel vehicles to be deposited into the State Highway Fund.	TRN, FIN
<u>SB 162, SD2, HD2</u> <u>(HSCR1599)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO TAXATION. Amends the amount of the rental motor vehicle surcharge tax. Repeals the additional surcharge tax for lessees who do not possess a valid Hawaii driver's license. Deposits the surcharge tax revenues into the state highway fund, for statewide use, and the county subaccounts in the state highway fund for highway road capacity projects in the county that generated the surcharge tax. <u>SB 1297, SD2, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR1572)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO MOTOR VEHICLES. Requires an application for motor vehicle registration to include additional identifying information. Requires the counties to fine the legal or registered owner of an abandoned or derelict vehicle. Requires the legal or registered owner to have up-to-date motor vehicle registration and motor vehicle insurance prior to repossession of the abandoned vehicle.	TRN, JUD, FIN


