SB 166, SD1 (SSCR1191) Status	RELATING TO THE STATE BUDGET. Establishes in the Department of Human Resources Development a recruitment modernization program to address employee recruitment problems faced by the State's executive departments. Makes an appropriation to establish the program and positions to implement the program. Effective 7/1/2050.	FIN
SB 1002, SD1 (SSCR947) Status	RELATING TO THE ISSUANCE OF SPECIAL PURPOSE REVENUE BONDS TO ASSIST SEAWATER AIR CONDITIONING PROJECTS ON OAHU. SB 763, SD2, HD1 (HSCR1651) Status	RELATING TO ADVERTISING AND MARKETING. Requires the Department of Business, Economic Development, and Tourism, in consultation with the Department of Agriculture, to conduct a study to assess the impact of companies selling products in the United States using place-based marketing without any material ties to the State.
