<u>HB 664</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO GENDER IDENTITY. Prohibits both sexual orientation and gender identity change efforts under Chapter 453J, Hawaii Revised Statutes.	HLT, JUD/CPC
<u>HB 666</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO HEALTH. Establishes a comprehensive healthcare task force in the Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs to study and report on specified major issues relating to healthcare.	HLT, CPC
<u>HB 854</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO FOOD DONATION. Expands liability protection for donors to include donations of food and similar donations made directly to needy persons. Authorizes the donation of expired food when the donor believes in good faith that the food remains fit for human consumption.	HLT, JUD
<u>HB 1201</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO HEALTH. Appropriates moneys for the department of health's lead poisoning prevention activities.	HLT, FIN
<u>HB 678</u> <u>Proposed HD1</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO HEALTH. Proposed HD1: Amends the Newborn Hearing Screening statute to mandate reporting of diagnostic audiologic evaluation results to improve hearing follow-up of infants and to update definitions and terminology. <u>HB 888</u> <u>Status</u>	MAKING APPROPRIATIONS TO THE MAUI HEALTH SYSTEM. Makes appropriations for fiscal biennium 2019-2021 to support the operations of the Maui Health System.	HLT, FIN



<u>HB 898</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE BOARD OF HEALTH. Deletes statutory references pertaining to the abolished Board of Health.	HLT, FIN
<u>HB 142, HD1</u> <u>Proposed HD2</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO HEALTH. Proposed HD2: Food Service Establishments; Calorie Information Copies of the proposed HD2 are available in room 402 and on the Legislature's Web site: http://www.capitol.hawaii.gov .	HLT, CPC
<u>HB 1221</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO MENTAL HEALTH. Amends the definitions of "dangerous to others" and "dangerous to self" in chapter 334, Hawaii Revised Statutes, to include the refusal to take medication or undergo mental health treatment necessary to help prevent self-inflicted violence and violence to others.	HLT, JUD
<u>HB 1269</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO AUTISM SPECTRUM DISORDERS. Clarifies the professionals who may administer autism treatment under mandated insurance coverage establish by Luke's Law.	HLT, CPC
<u>HB 1453</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES. Authorizes the Department of Health to establish fees for transportation to medical facilities and for provision of emergency medical services that do not include transport. Authorizes transportation by ambulance to medical facilities other than hospital emergency departments.	HLT, FIN
<u>HB 523</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE GENERAL EXCISE TAX. Exempts gross receipts from the sale of mobility enhancing equipment and durable medical equipment from the general excise tax. Amends the definition of "prosthetic device" to include devices worn on the body. Exempts gross receipts from the repair of prosthetic devices from the general excise tax.	HLT, FIN
<u>HB 632</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE GENERAL EXCISE TAX. Exempts the sales of mobility enhancing equipment sold by prescription, prosthetic devices, prescription drugs sold pursuant to a prescription, diabetic supplies, medical oxygen, and human blood and its derivatives from the general excise tax for taxable years beginning after December 31, 2018. Amends the definitions of "prosthetic device" and "prescription drugs".	HLT, FIN
<u>HB 490</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE LICENSURE OF MIDWIVES. Establishes licensure of midwives including scope of practice, professional code of conduct, continuing education requirements, and prescriptive drug authority. Appropriates funds from the compliance resolution fund. Exempts traditional birth attendants and Native Hawaiian healers from licensure requirements.	HLT, CPC

Submit testimony in ONE of the following ways:


PAPER: 8 copies (including an original) to Room 403 in the State Capitol;
