<u>HB 471</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO AGING. Requires the policy advisory board for elder affairs to establish quorum requirements through its bylaws and post its bylaws on the executive office on aging's website.	HSH, JUD
<u>HB 946</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO CHILD SUPPORT. Amends the income withholding requirements to impose a fine against any employer who (1) discharges from employment, refuses to employ, or takes disciplinary action against any noncustodial parent subject to income withholding or (2) fails to withhold support from income or pay the amounts to the Child Support Enforcement Agency; and amends the amount of the annual fee imposed by the Child Support Enforcement Agency to be in compliance with federal regulations. <u>HB 1000</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO CHILD CARE. Requires criminal history checks of adult relatives who provide care for a child whose family receives a child care subsidy from the Department of Human Services, clarifies that the Department of Human Services may take both administrative and judicial action to enforce child care licensing provisions of chapter 346, Hawaii Revised Statutes, clarifies the role and response of the child care licensing program when it receives a report of death or injury of a child in a child care setting, and addresses the release of information pending an investigation. <u>HB 1013</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO INVOLUNTARY HOSPITALIZATION. Permits the Director of Health to designate emergency departments to which persons requiring emergency mental health treatment may be taken by law enforcement.	HSH, JUD, FIN

Status

RELATING TO CHILD CARE HOMES.

HSH, IAC, JUD

Requires the Department of Human Services to provide certification of group child care homes that meet certain qualifications and requirements, including programming for preschool aged children. Clarifies that caregivers in any family child care home or group child care home in the State are not required to be members of the same household. Allows any family child care home or group child care home to have a single, street-fronting sign with information regarding its name and days and hours of operation. Increases the maximum number of children that may be cared for in a family child care home or group child care home. Specifies the minimum required caregiver-child ratio in a family child care home.

DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW

Persons wishing to offer comments should submit testimony at least 24 hours prior to the hearing. Testimony should indicate:

- Testifier's name with position/title and organization;
- The Committee(s) to which the comments are directed;
- The date and time of the hearing; and
- Measure number.

While every effort will be made to incorporate all testimony received, materials received on the day of the hearing or improperly identified or directed, may be distributed to the Committee after the hearing.

Submit testimony in ONE of the following ways:


