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| <u>SB 50, SD2</u> <u>(SSCR735)</u> <u>Status</u> | RELATING TO HUMAN SERVICES. Appropriates funds to the University of Hawaii for the Hawaii Nutrition Employment and Training Program. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2) | HSH, FIN |
| <u>SB 1230, SD2</u> <u>(SSCR1161)</u> <u>Status</u> | RELATING TO YOUTH SERVICES PROGRAMS. Permits individual vocational programs within the purview of the Office of Youth Services to engage in commercial enterprises, including the sales of goods and services, for self-sustainability purposes. Establishes the Office of Youth Services revolving fund. Appropriates funds. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2) | HSH, FIN |

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| <u>SB 330, SD1</u> <u>(SSCR701)</u> <u>Status</u> | RELATING TO AN EARNED INCOME DISREGARD PROGRAM. Requires the Department of Human Services to implement an earned income disregard program as an intermediate step to implementing a medicaid buy-in program. Requires reports to the legislature. Takes effect upon approval by the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD1) | HSH, FIN |
