RELATING TO ELECTIONS.

JUD, FIN

Status

Provides ranked choice method of voting for all partisan primary elections, special elections, and nonpartisan general elections held in

this State on or after 1/1/2020.

HB 1514

RELATING TO CAMPAIGN FINANCE.

JUD, FIN

Status

Replaces the option for a taxpayer to indicate on an income tax form a contribution to the Hawaii election campaign fund with an option for a taxpayer to apply any amount to the fund. Amends provisions relating

to the ability of publicly-funded candidates to receive and expend

campaign funds.

RELATING TO CAMPAIGN FINANCE.

Creates a comprehensive public funding program for candidates for county elections beginning in 2022. Appropriates funds to the

HB 766 <u>Status</u>

RELATING TO SERVICE IN NON-CRIMINAL PROCEEDINGS.

Authorizes service of notice and process by electronic mail in non-

criminal and administrative proceedings, with certain

exceptions. Extends the time for response after service by mail to at

least five days

RELATING TO CRIMINAL PROCEDURE. HB 1061 JUD, FIN Status Creates procedural and administrative requirements for law enforcement agencies for eyewitness identifications of suspects in criminal investigations. Grants a defendant the right to challenge any eyewitness identification to be used at trial in a pretrial evidentiary hearing. Effective January 1, 2020. RELATING TO HAWAII CRIMINAL JUSTICE DATA CENTER HB 947 JUD, FIN Status FEES. Provides authority for the Hawaii Criminal Justice Data Center to set and collect fees for services provided. RELATING TO CRIME VICTIM COMPENSATION FOR MENTAL HB 437 JUD, FIN HEALTH SERVICES. Status Authorizes crime victim compensation for mental health services for survivors in cases involving a death and for children who witness domestic violence. RELATING TO RESTITUTION FOR VICTIMS OF CRIME. <u>HB 410</u> JUD, FIN Clarifies that reimbursement to crime victims includes lost wages, Status mental health treatment, and therapy. RELATING TO THE JUDICIARY. HB 903 JUD, FIN **Status** Requires the Judiciary to implement a program that offers any qualifying person the option to fulfill any court-ordered financial obligation through: (1) installment payments in a payment plan; or (2) the performance of community service. Prohibits the courts from taking certain actions against a person solely because of that person's inability to pay if the person has entered into and is in compliance with the programs. Reinstates driver's licenses that were suspended for nonpayment under certain circumstances. RELATING TO LOBBYISTS. HB 171 JUD, FIN Removes statutory remnants from when violations of the lobbyist law Status resulted in criminal penalties. Allows the state ethics commission to assess an administrative fine pursuant to a settlement agreement. HB 170 RELATING TO ETHICS. JUD <u>Status</u> Restores statutory protection for legislators when carrying out a legislative function. Clarifies public disclosure requirements for task force members. HB 169 RELATING TO THE STATE ETHICS CODE. JUD Clarifies the State Ethics Code by clarifying provisions regarding gift Status disclosure statements, retention of financial disclosure statements, and ethics training. HB 1381 RELATING TO LOBBYISTS. JUD Status Prohibits former legislators and executive branch employees subject to senate confirmation from engaging in lobbying for 24 months after termination of employment as a legislator or executive branch

employee. Effective 7/1/2021.

HB 366 Status RELATING TO CAMPAIGN FINANCE.

JUD, FIN

Establishes an exemption from the prohibition against using election campaign funds to make charitable donations or to award scholarships during the period from the filing of nomination papers to the date of the general election for candidates who are already declared elected to office after running unopposed in an election or who would be unopposed in the general election.

HB 627 Status RELATING TO CAMPAIGN FINANCE.

Establishes that a photograph of a person used in campaign shall be reported as an in-kind contribution to the respective candidate or noncandidate committee. Imposes a fine on a committee that uses a photograph in a campaign without the photographed person's authorization. Classifies any independent expenditure as a contribution to a candidate or as a contribution to each opposing candidate. Requires any advertisement by a noncandidate committee that makes only independent expenditures to disclose all contributors for the advertisement.

HB 164 Status RELATING TO ELECTIONEERING COMMUNICATIONS. Amends the definition of "disclosure date" in section 11-341(d), HRS, to mean the date when the electioneering communication is publicly distributed. Expands the definition of "electioneering communication" in section 11-341(d), HRS, to apply to advertisements sent by any mail rate and those that are expenditures of an organization. Repeals section 11-341(e), HRS.

HB 162 Status RELATING TO VIOLATIONS OF CAMPAIGN FINANCE LAW. Increases the fine that may be assessed, for campaign spending law violations, against a noncandidate committee making only independent expenditures and that has received at least 1 contribution of more than \$10,000, or spent more than \$10,000 in an election period. Allows the Campaign Spending Commission to order that payment of a fine assessed against a noncandidate committee, or any portion thereof, be paid from the personal funds of an officer of the noncandidate committee.

HB 680 Status RELATING TO INTERNAL REVENUE CODE SECTION 501(C)(4) JUD, FIN ORGANIZATIONS.

Requires an organization that is exempt from federal taxation under IRC section 501(c)(4) to submit semi-annual reports to the campaign spending commission if the organization expends funds to make communications that advocate for or against elected officials or their positions on government actions.

HB 1280 Status PROPOSING AN AMENDMENT TO THE HAWAII CONSTITUTION, ARTICLE II, SECTION 1, TO EXPAND THE RIGHT TO VOTE.

Lowers the right to vote in state and local elections to those who are sixteen years of age or older per the Hawaii Constitution.

HB 1263 Status RELATING TO ORDER OF SUCCESSION.

Amends the order of succession to the office of lieutenant governor.

Requires vacancies in the offices of United States Senator, State Senator, and State Representative to be filled by special election.
