HB 249
Status

RELATING TO SCHOOL PSYCHOLOGISTS.
Establishes licensure requirements for school psychologists to be administered by the Hawaii teacher standards board. Specifies that school psychologists who are employed by an educational institution and practice only within a school setting shall be exempt from licensure under chapter 465.

HB 506
Status

RELATING TO ALTERNATIVE SCHOOLS FOR JUVENILES.
Appropriates funds to the Department of Education for an alternative school to provide ongoing education to juveniles involved in the justice system or at risk of involvement in the justice system.

HB 382
Status

RELATING TO THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION.
Requires the Auditor to conduct a management and program audit of the Department of Education's policies relating to bullying and cyberbullying, especially as they apply to students who are members of certain minority groups.

HB 317
Status

RELATING TO EDUCATION.
Establishes a pilot program for a low- or no-cost daycare for children of working parents. Appropriates funds.

HB 411
Status

RELATING TO THE BOARD OF EDUCATION.
Requires the board of education to hold no less than six community meetings each year; provided that at least one meeting shall be held in each county. Requires the board of education to allow public testimony on items not on a public meeting agenda if certain requirements are met. Repeals the public testimony requirement on June 30, 2024. Requires the board of education to report to the legislature.

HB 615
Status

RELATING TO THE BOARD OF EDUCATION.
Amends the Board of Education membership by inviting the exclusive representative for bargaining unit (5) (teachers and other personnel of the Department of Education) to appoint a nonvoting public school teacher representative to the Board.

HB 620
Status

PROPOSING AN AMENDMENT TO THE HAWAII
CONSTITUTION TO REQUIRE THE ELECTION OF MEMBERS
OF THE BOARD OF EDUCATION.
Proposes a constitutional amendment to change the Board of Education back to an elected board.

Status

RELATING TO EDUCATION.
Implements an elected board of education.

DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW

Submit testimony in ONE of the following ways:


