RELATING TO CIVIL RIGHTS.  
Requires the Legislative Reference Bureau to submit by 1/24/2019, a report studying how other jurisdictions oversee Title IX enforcement.

Status

RELATING TO REMOTE TESTIMONY IN LEGISLATIVE HEARINGS.  
Requires each house of the Legislature to establish, by rule, procedures for the public to present oral testimony at legislative committee hearings through remote testimony. Appropriates funds.

RELATING TO VISITOR INFORMATION.  
Establishes a Visitor Information Center in the State Capitol.  
Establishes a Visitor Information Center Program to support the operations of the Visitor Information Center. Appropriates funds.

RELATING TO THE STATE CAPITOL.  
Provides the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives the authority to jointly allocate and assign for occupation non-metered parking stalls and all office space at the state capitol except the fifth floor. Provides the Governor the authority to allocate office space on the fifth floor of the state capitol.

DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW

Persons wishing to offer comments should submit testimony at least 24 hours prior to the hearing. Testimony should indicate:

- Testifier's name with position/title and organization;
- The Committee(s) to which the comments are directed;
- The date and time of the hearing; and
- Measure number.

While every effort will be made to incorporate all testimony received, materials received on the day of the hearing or improperly identified or directed, may be distributed to the Committee after the hearing.

Submit testimony in ONE of the following ways:

PAPER: 3 copies (including an original) to Room 432 in the State Capitol;


FAX: For testimony less than 5 pages in length, transmit to 808-586-6684 (Oahu) or 1-800-535-3859 (for Neighbor Islander without a computer to submit testimony through e-mail or the Web); or

WEB: For testimony less than 20MB in size, transmit from <http://www.capitol.hawaii.gov/submittestimony.aspx>.

Testimony submitted will be placed on the legislative website. This public posting of testimony on the website should be considered when including personal information in your testimony.

**If during the course of the hearing it appears there will not be sufficient time to allow everyone to be heard, the chairperson reserves the right to limit the remaining testifiers to three-minutes. This three-minute policy will be enforced to ensure fairness and adequate consideration to all bills.**
