or participate in gambling. (HB159 HD1)

Requires county police departments to disclose to the (HSCR1184) Legislature the identity of an officer upon an officer's suspension

or discharge. Amends the Uniform Information Practices Act to Status & allow for public access to information about suspended officers. **Testimony**
