Designates the public lands on the Waiakea peninsula on the island of Hawaii as the Waiakea Peninsula Redevelopment District. Repeals the Waiakea Peninsula

Redevelopment District on 6/30/2029. Appropriates funds.

Status Allows holdovers of revocable water permits to continue until the pending application for a lease is resolved. Requires prompt execution

of contested case proceedings for 1-year holdovers. Allows holdovers to continue pending completion of contested case proceedings. Removes repeal and reenactment provisions relating to section 171-

58(c), Hawaii Revised Statutes.

This three-minute policy will be enforced to ensure fairness and adequate consideration to all bills.
