| <u>SB 1471, SD1</u> <u>(SSCR666)</u> <u>Status</u> | RELATING TO CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS FOR THE COUNTY OF MAUI. Authorizes the Director of Finance to issue general obligation bonds to finance the planning of the Wailuku-Kahului Transit Corridor Master Plan in the county of Maui. Effective 7/1/2050. Appropriates funds for the Department of Land and Natural Resources priority projects, including the industrial and business park at Pulehunui, East Kapolei/University of Hawaii, west Oahu campus transit station development, and the Hawaii district land office. Effective 7/1/2050. | WLH, FIN |

DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW
