BURIAL COUNCIL, ISLANDS OF KAUA'I AND NI'HAU'I, GUBERNATORIAL
NOMINEE, JOHNNETTE KAHALEKAI FOR A TERM TO EXPIRE 6-30-2019**

The Department of Land and Natural Resources (Department) supports Governor's Message 622, nominating Ms. Johnnette Kahalekai to the Island Burial Council, Islands of Kaua'i and Ni'ihau expiring June 30, 2019.

The Island Burial Councils are established under Section 6E-43.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes. The Councils determine whether to preserve or relocate previously identified native Hawaiian burial sites, recognize lineal and cultural descendants, and provide counsel and advice to the Department.

Ms. Kahalekai was born and raised on the island of Kaua'i. She attended Kaua'i High School, University of Hawai'i for a year and the Kaua'i Community College, where she earned a construction Technician Certificate. She currently sits on the Kupuna Council of Kaua'i that is sponsored by Ho'ola Lahui/Papa Lokahi,. Johnnette is an ordained Kahu and Wedding Officiant at the Church of Universal Light. Ms. Kahalekai is a ho'oponopono practitioner.

Senate confirmation will ensure that Ms. Kahalekai's knowledge and perspective informs the deliberations of the Kaua'i Ni'ihau Islands Burial Council until June 30, 2019.
