EXECUTIVE OFFICE ON EARLY LEARNING'S POSITION: Support

Good afternoon. I am Lauren Moriguchi, Director of the Executive Office on Early Learning (EOEL). EOEL strongly supports the confirmation of Ms. Leilani Au to the Early Learning Board, for a term to expire June 30, 2020.

The Early Learning Board is EOEL's governing entity, and is tasked in statute with formulating statewide policy relating to early learning. We note that Ms. Au's confirmation would not be to the Early Learning Advisory Board, but the Early Learning Board, due to the statutory change made in 2017.

The input of center-based program providers is critical as EOEL works to carry out its statutory responsibility to develop Hawaii's early learning system, which shall ensure a spectrum of high-quality development and learning opportunities for children throughout the state, from prenatal care until the time they enter kindergarten, with priority given to underserved or at-risk children. Our community-based providers have been the mainstay of early learning programs and services for decades. EOEL's charge is coordinate, improve, and expand *all* existing early learning programs and services, whether publicly or privately run, which consist of a variety of early learning approaches, service deliveries, and settings – including center-based programs. As such, the center-based program provider representative on the Board carries an important role.

Ms. Au is director of the UH Manoa Children's Center that serves children ages two to five, and I attest to her reputation as an exemplary administrator. She also has rich background in other aspects of the early childhood field, including as an infant-toddler caregiver, preschool teacher, lecturer for early childhood education courses, and coach for numerous programs seeking accreditation. Her dedication and experience will be a great asset to the Board.

Thank you for the opportunity to testify in strong support of Ms. Au's confirmation.
