- 1 Fiscal Implications: N/A.
- 2 **Department Testimony:** The Department of Health supports the repeal of the Board of Health
- 3 for two primary reasons.
- 4 The first is that the entire Board has been vacant for the past several years due to a lack of
- 5 interest from members willing to serve. Section 26-13, Hawaii Revised Statutes, established 11
- 6 members appointed by the Governor, but despite recruitment efforts the department has been
- 7 unable to convene a Board that meets quorum.
- 8 The second justification is that an advisory board for a centralized state public health agency is
- 9 no longer necessary due to the evolution of state and federal regulations, community standards of
- practice, grant guidance, and legislative oversight.
- Boards of Health often add value to local or municipal jurisdictions on the mainland where they
- often have supervision, enforcement, and policy-making authority. However, the scope of the
- Hawaii Department of Health is too broad and complex spanning public health, behavioral
- health, and environmental protection for meaningful advisement by a generalist board
