Hawai'i Center for Food Safety supports: SCR118 with amendments

Dear Chair Creagan, Vice-Chair DeCoite, and members of the committee,

My name is Autumn Ness and I am the Co-Director of the Hawai'i Center for Food Safety (HCFS). HCFS is a nationwide public interest, sustainable agriculture nonprofit organization whose mission centers on supporting the increase of sustainable local food production, and increasing public transparency in food production. We have over 1 million farmer and consumer members across the country, including nearing 10,000 in Hawai'i.

The Hawai'i Center for Food Safety would like to mahalo Senators Dela Cruz and the cosponsors of this resolution for recognizing that an increase in local milk production is an important part of restoring Hawai'i's food security.

The recent lawsuit and settlement with Big Island Dairy regarding their violations of the Clean Water Act, and the confirmed release of millions of gallons of animal waste into nearby waterways over numerous incidents illustrates the need for us to encourage the shift away from concentrated dairy operations and toward a more sustainable model of diversified agriculture which includes milk production.

The Hawai'i Center for Food Safety is concerned that by designating areas for dairy operations, the DOA will be encouraging the existence of multiple concentrated dairy operations in a single large area. Concentrated dairy operations are known to have disastrous impacts on environment, including nearby waterways, and have a higher incidence of disease among dairy cows.

HCFS is requesting that SCR118 be amended to include language that clarifies that designated areas for dairy operation do not allow for operations of medium/large Concentrated Animal Feeding Operations (CAFO), as defined by the EPA. Please see EPA Regulatory Definitions of Large, Medium and Small CAFOs attached.



We are also requesting that the SCR118 request the Department of Agriculture to include in their report recommended incentives for locally owned dairy operations, and/or operations that are less than the threshold for EPA medium or large CAFO designation, and/or dairy operations that operate as part of a diversified agricultural model that uses dairy waste as a resource, keeping it out of our waterways.

Regulatory Definitions of Large CAFOs, Medium CAFO, and Small CAFOs

A Large CAFO confines at least the number of animals described in the table below.

A Medium CAFO falls within the size range in the table below and either:

- · has a manmade ditch or pipe that carries manure or wastewater to surface water; or
- · the animals come into contact with surface water that passes through the area where they're confined.

If an operation is found to be a significant contributor of pollutants, the permitting authority may designate a medium-sized facility as a CAFO.

A Small CAFO confines fewer than the number of animals listed in the table and has been designated as a CAFO by the permitting authority as a significant contributor of pollutants.

We strongly oppose SCR118. Not only is the dairy industry incredibly cruel but it heavily contributes to both air and water pollution. Cattle naturally produce methane, which has a warming effect on the planet that's 20 times greater than carbon dioxide, causing animal agriculture to have a larger effect on global warming than the transportation industry.

This is **also a poor investment for Hawaii to make economically.** Some of the largest dairy companies are investing tens of millions of dollars in dairy-free alternatives due to an increase in demand for dairy-free products. Even Forbes has reported multiple times over the last few years that this trend is anticipated to rise. It would be unwise to put time and resources into this industry while some of its top contributing companies are already predicting its eventual demise.

I am testifying in opposition to SCR 118, which seeks to request the Department of Agriculture to designate areas in each county for dairy operations and develop incentives to attract dairy operators to the state. I am currently serving as president of the Vegetarian Society of Hawai'i, one of the largest vegetarian societies in the country, which has an educational mission, to promote human health, animal rights and protection of the environment by means of vegetarian, whole food, plant-based vegan education.

Why should this resolution not be adopted?

Behind this resolution is the idea that having more local dairies in each county would help to ensure a steady, secure source of cow's milk, erroneously considered to be an essential part of people's diets in Hawai'i.

Many of the older generation here in Hawai'i remember that when they were children, nearly all of them and their classmates were active and slim, and it was rare to be or to see a child among them that was not. Today, it is a heartbreakingly commonplace thing to see so many of our young people suffering from obesity and the beginnings of lifetime problems with diabetes and heart disease.

Too many of the adults in their lives, as well, both at home and in the community, are also suffering from the debilitating consequences of these same problems. It is a health epidemic that is growing in this country and in Hawaii, taking away from the quality of life that our people should be enjoying, and becoming an economic burden both in the private and the governmental sector, as an ever greater proportion of our population needs expensive medical care, and medical insurance costs eat away at the paychecks of even the healthier among us. It takes away from the prosperity of our people, their productivity, and even their happiness, as sick people are often depressed people, as well.

Astonishingly, as huge as our healthcare crisis is, it doesn't have to stay this way. We can make an enormous difference for the better by making simple and

It is widely acknowledged that that our large, sick population was created by lifestyle choices, especially in our choice of diet.

One reason for this is the great increase in dairy in the diet of people in Hawai'i in the intervening decades. It is well-documented that people can prevent or recover from many health conditions by reducing or eliminating dairy and other animal products from their diet, and replacing them with healthful fresh plant-based foods.

Dairy is not an essential in a healthy diet in Hawai'i, was never a part of the traditional diet of native Hawaiians and many other Pacific islanders, and the nutrients it delivers can be well-provided by plant-based foods.

For those who choose to consume dairy products anyway, more than enough is available from outside sources and the single remaining dairy in Hawai'i without needing to further burden our 'aina, as the same amount of food can be grown on less land in plant-based agriculture with less pollution of the land, water and air as compared to animal agriculture.

To this end, we should be promoting more plant-based agriculture and not dairy farms.

The dairy farm that is being required to close by an Administrative Order on Consent with the Hawai'i Department of Health, mentioned in the resolution, was not welcome by its neighbors due to pollution of the environment, including that of the air and state waters. It has proven difficult and even unavoidable for other animal agriculture operations to avoid polluting their local environments, as well, often doing so on a massive scale on the mainland by many of the best-known brands in dairy and meat products. Let's not follow their unhappy lead in harming the 'aina in Hawai'i, as well.

Please also note that modern dairy farming in varying degrees also involves inhumane treatment of helpless animals who are forced into unnatural lives and deaths to provide humans with milk normally reserved only for their own young.

For these reasons, I strongly urge that you vote against this resolution. Thank you for considering this!

Comments:

I am urging you all to oppose this measure. Dairies are harmful in every way imaginable. People are moving away from dairy products for good reason. Many people are beginning to realize the scientifically established ill effects of dairy from allergic reactions to osteoporosis and other chronic diseases such as heart disease, diabetes, and cancer.

If this isn't convincing enough, dairies bring air and water pollution these islands can ill afford. Our picturesque and precious beaches and coral reefs must be protected.
