The long-term goal is to have the Sand Island Complex to become the major venue in Hawaii in creating a training venue and playing facility, serving as a model for young student athletes throughout Hawaii and experience the ultimate feeling in playing in a first class facility.

Since 2010, the Hawaii Softball Foundation entered into an adopt-a-park agreement with DLNR State Parks to renovate two abandoned baseball/softball fields. The foundation privately funded the renovations and in 2011 opened one field for games and one for practice. Over the last 8 years the foundation has proved its ability to manage the various responsibilities that will be required once the complex is built. We have maintained the playability of the fields despite being used 80% of the year, managed the user profiles with no public complaints, and have become a great asset to the park by driving away the negative activities that have existed.

2. Facilities

DLNR State Parks will break ground on the Sand Island Softball Complex in the spring of 2020. They have allocated \$3.0 million to this renovation, which includes 5 softball fields, the parking lot, and comfort station. Hawaii Softball Foundation have been working with them continuously over the last 8 years to make this a reality. Once completed, the Hawaii Softball Foundation will be entering into a long-term contract with

the DLNR to manage and maintain the complex as we have over the last 9 years under their Adopt-a-Park program.

The Hawaii Softball Foundation will use the complex as the cornerstone for its programs. The facility will be the first youth softball complex in the State and provide a quality venue to improve participation in Hawaii. It will enhance our registrations in our youth programs and help keep our youth on the right track. The educational and programming opportunities that the complex brings will further our mission to use softball as a vehicle to develop our youth into contributing members of our society.

Don continues to organize, manage, and support all levels of softball in the state and plays an integral part of everything that involves the sport locally and nationally.

Jon Okada – Jon is the vice chairman of the Hawaii Softball Foundation since its inception and has worked with USA softball in the past. Jon has been instrumental in navigation the partnership with the State to construct the softball complex. He continues to be involved in the collegiate process for Hawaii's youth and maintains relationships with the various softball organizations across the country.

John Uekawa – John is the president of New City Nissan and has been with the Hawaii Softball Foundation since its inception. John founded the HSF's scholarship program in 2009 and to date the foundation has awarded over \$35,000 to help our softball athletes offset their post secondary education. He created and supports the Goodwill Softball Classic for high school seniors. In its 12th year the Classic is the most successful senior event in the state. John remains active in the softball coaching arena as he is in his 12th season as the varsity head coach at Maryknoll School.

Ken Richardson – Ken is the president of Island Controls and was a co-founder of the Hawaii Softball Foundation. Ken continues to sit on the executive board for USA Softball for the last 20 years and lead the first group in creating softball events in Hawaii that attracted mainland teams. Ken continues to work behind the scenes guiding our board in the right direction.

Stanley Mahelona – Stanley joined the Foundation board in 2016 and is the owner of one of the largest baseball/softball retail stores in Hawaii. He continues to support a variety of youth organizations through donations and sponsorships. For the last 12 years Stanley has served as Hawaii's player representative for softball and is one of the most knowledgeable tournament organizers for the sport.

Erin Sakai – Erin joined our board in 2011 and immediately took over the role of treasurer. Erin is a CPA and the controller for Grace Pacific. She brings a unique perspective to the board as she participated in Hawaii high school softball and went on to play collegiate softball at Pacific University.

Georges Gilbert – Georges is our newest member joining us in 2018. He has been the director of athletics for the ILH since 2010 and was instrumental in guiding high school sports to where it is today. He brings that knowledge and experience to the board and has helped in our outreach to the public.


