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PUBLIC PURPOSE:

This grant will be used for a public purpose pursuant to Section 42F-102, Hawaii Revised Statues.

This grant to the Ocean View Community Association, Inc. for \$82,520 will be used to resurface the upper and lower parking lots of the Ocean View Community Center (OVCC).

The OVCC provides quality services related to education, health and safety, and community forums to the residents of Ocean View and the surrounding Ka'u District including towns of Pahala, Discovery Harbour, Na'alehu, and Wai'ohinu.

These services include partnerships with several civic organizations and community, governmental and nonprofit organizations by providing an event venue. These include the Boys & Girls Club, Early Head Start, HI Disability Legal Aid, AdvoCats spay/neuter clinics, Dept of Human Services; Community Emergency Response Team; Volunteer Fire Fighters, Neighborhood Watch; Veterans medical transportation services; Hawaii Volcanoes National Park and various forums of community interest. The OVCC is also a voter precinct for state, local and national elections.



BACKGROUND AND SUMMARY:

The Ocean View Community Association, Inc. (OVCA) strives to enhance the quality of life in rural Hawaii. The OVCA serves the community of Ocean View and all the Ka'u District of Hawaii Island. The organization was established in 1969 to provide quality services related to education, health and safety, and community forums. The OVCA is managed entirely by unpaid volunteers and funded by membership dues, donations, facility rental and grants. The organization receives no sustained county or state financial support.

The Ocean View Community Center (OVCC) was built in 1979 by volunteers and mostly donated materials. It is located on 3 acres in Hawaii Ocean View Estates (HOVE). Office is staffed by volunteers Monday through Friday, 8 am to noon and the facility is made available daily until 9 pm. The OVCC is the only facility in the Ocean View area that can accommodate small and large events. It has a stage, audio/visual equipment and a commercial type kitchen. There is a lending library, children's reading room, and free WiFi with computer access. The center also maintains a Department of Civil Defense generator.

Both the upper and lower parking lots of the OVCC are in critical need of resurfacing. Over 50 years of increasing use has resulted in many large potholes, loose rock, and uneven surfaces. Parking is impacted and walking across the parking lots can be unsafe and hazardous. The condition of the parking lots prevents the OVCA providing outside activities for the 150 children who use the facility on a weekly basis. This grant request will be used to resurface 20,454 sq. ft. of parking space and allow the OVCC to continue to provide educational, health & fitness, veteran services, medical services, and informational and community action activities.

The OVCA partners with several civic organizations and community, governmental and nonprofit organizations by providing an event venue. These include the Boys & Girls Club, Early Head Start, HI Disability Legal Aid, AdvoCats spay/neuter clinics, Dept of Human Services; Community Emergency Response Team; Volunteer Fire Fighters, Neighborhood Watch; Veterans medical transportation services; Hawaii Volcanoes National Park and various other forums of community interest. The OVCC is also a voter precinct for state, local and national elections.

The US Census Bureau's American Survey for 2014 – 2018 found that Hawaiian Ocean View Estates grew the most of all towns in the Ka'u District. The estimates show 26.49% population growth in HOVE, from 3,747 to 4,891. There is an additional population of 4,206 residing in the surrounding Ka'u District that are included in the 922 square mile service area of OVCA.

SERVICE SUMMARY AND OUTCOMES:

The scope of work covers the resurfacing of the upper and lower parking lots of the Ocean View Community Center.

These two areas encompass 20,454 sq. ft. The proposal covers cleaning the areas of loose large rock, rolling to smooth out surface, laying a leveling course of asphalt ½" to 1" thick, and capping the areas with 1 1/2" asphalt.

Project completion will not exceed 10 days from start of project. Initial payment of \$47,520 is due at signing of proposal and remaining balance \$38,000 upon completion.

Expected outcomes of the finished project will allow the OVCA to provide safe access to the facility and increase the number of community events and offer outside activities for all ages. To measure the effectiveness of the project the OVCA will track the usage and frequency of new and existing activities and events.

EXPERIENCE AND CAPABILITY:

All equipment, labor, and materials will be furnished by a contractor licensed in the State of Hawaii.

The licensed contractor shall warrant all materials and workmanship for a period of one year from completion of project. Contractor shall name Ocean View Community Association, Inc. as an additional insured on its comprehensive general liability insurance policy for the period during its performance.

The Ocean View Community Center is a two-story 6000 square foot structure and includes 4 bathrooms, a commercial type kitchen, stage with audio/visual equipment, lending library, children's reading room and a main hall with a seating capacity of 200. The facility is owned and operated by the Ocean View Community Association, Inc which carries the fire, hurricane, general and Directors and Officers liability insurance.

PERSONNEL: PROJECT ORGANIZATION AND STAFFING

Not applicable. Project to be completed by a contractor licensed in the State of Hawaii. Ocean View Community Association, Inc. has an eight-member governing board whose members have no material conflict of interest and serve without compensation.

The Board of Directors will be responsible for the supervision of the satisfactory completion of the proposed project.

OTHER:

The Ocean View Community Association, Inc. is not a party to any pending litigation or outstanding judgments.

The OVCA was incorporated under the laws of Hawaii on 5/15/1969; and is an existing nonprofit corporation and as far as the records of the Department of Commerce And Consumer Affairs reveal, has complied with all of the provisions of the Hawaii Nonprofit Corporations Act, regulating domestic nonprofit corporations.

This grant will not be used to support or benefit sectarian or non-sectarian private education institutions.

FUTURE SUSTAINABILITY PLAN:

This grant request for fiscal year 2020-21 will be the only monies needed by the Ocean View Community Association, Inc. for project completion to resurface the community center parking lots.
