
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE BUDGET OF THE DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE AND
CONSUMER AFFAIRS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 **PART I. GENERAL PROVISIONS**

2 SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to establish
3 additional amounts to be appropriated or authorized for the
4 operating budget for the fiscal biennium beginning July 1, 2019,
5 and ending June 30, 2021, for certain state executive branch
6 programs under the purview of the house of representatives
7 standing committee on intrastate commerce.

8 SECTION 2. DEFINITIONS. Unless otherwise clear from the
9 context, as used in this Act:

10 "Expending agency" means the department of commerce and
11 consumer affairs.

12 Abbreviations, where used to denote the expending agency or
13 a house of representatives standing committee, shall mean the
14 following:

15 CCA Department of commerce and consumer affairs



1 IAC House of representatives standing committee on
2 intrastate commerce

3 "Means of financing" or "MOF" means the source from which
4 funds are appropriated or authorized to be expended for the
5 programs and projects specified in this Act. All appropriations
6 are followed by letter symbols. The letter symbols, where used,
7 shall have the following meanings:

8 B Special funds

9 "Program ID" means the unique identifier for the specific
10 program and consists of the abbreviation for the organization
11 responsible for carrying out the program followed by the
12 organization number for the program.

13 **PART II. PROGRAM APPROPRIATIONS**

14 SECTION 3. APPROPRIATIONS. The following sums, or so much
15 thereof as may be sufficient to accomplish the purposes and
16 programs designated herein, are hereby appropriated or
17 authorized, as the case may be, from the means of financing
18 specified to the expending agencies designated for the fiscal
19 biennium beginning July 1, 2019, and ending June 30, 2021. The
20 total expenditures in each fiscal year of the biennium shall not
21 exceed the sums indicated for each fiscal year, except as
22 provided elsewhere in this Act or as provided by general law.

1 **PART III. PROGRAM APPROPRIATION PROVISIONS**

2 SECTION 4. Provided that of the special fund
3 appropriations for insurance regulatory services (CCA106):

4 (1) The sum of \$2,500,000 or so much thereof as may be
5 necessary for fiscal year 2019-2020 and \$500,000 or so
6 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2020-
7 2021 shall be expended to fund the replacement of the
8 Hawaii insurance data system and corresponding
9 licensing, maintenance, and independent verification
10 and validation costs; and

11 (2) The sum of \$417,736 or so much thereof as may be
12 necessary for fiscal year 2019-2020 and the same sum
13 or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year
14 2020-2021 shall be expended to fund fringe benefit
15 costs for collective bargaining and salary
16 adjustments.

17 **PART IV. MISCELLANEOUS AND EFFECTIVE DATE**

18 SECTION 5. If any portion of this Act or its application
19 to any person, entity, or circumstance is held to be invalid for
20 any reason, then the legislature declares that the remainder of
21 the Act and each and every other provision thereof shall not be



1 affected thereby. If any portion of a specific appropriation is
2 held to be invalid for any reason, the remaining portion shall
3 be expended to fulfill the objective of the appropriation to the
4 extent possible.

5 SECTION 6. If manifest clerical, typographical, or other
6 mechanical errors are found in this Act, the governor may
7 correct the errors.

8 SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2030.
