RELATING TO STATE HOLIDAYS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 8-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2 amended to read as follows:

3 "**§8-1 Holidays designated.** The following days of each
4 year are set apart and established as state holidays:

5 The first day in January, New Year's Day;

6 The third Monday in January, Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.,
7 Day;

8 The third Monday in February, Presidents' Day;

9 The twenty-sixth day in March, Prince Jonah Kuhio
10 Kalaniana'ole Day;

11 The Friday preceding Easter Sunday, Good Friday;

12 The last Monday in May, Memorial Day;

13 The eleventh day in June, King Kamehameha I Day;

14 The fourth day in July, Independence Day;

15 The third Friday in August, Statehood Day;

16 The first Monday in September, Labor Day;

17 The eleventh day in November, Veterans' Day;

1 The fourth Thursday in November, Thanksgiving Day;
 2 The twenty-fifth day in December, Christmas Day;
 3 ~~[All election days, except primary and special election~~
 4 ~~days, in the county wherein the election is held,]~~
 5 Any day designated by proclamation by the President of the
 6 United States or by the governor as a holiday."

7 SECTION 2. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
 8 and stricken.

9 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
