
A BILL FOR AN ACT

MAKING EMERGENCY APPROPRIATIONS FOR PUBLIC EMPLOYMENT COST
ITEMS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 PART I

2 SECTION 1. This Act is recommended by the governor for
3 immediate passage in accordance with section 9 of article VII of
4 the Constitution of the State of Hawaii.

5 SECTION 2. There are appropriated from the sources of
6 funding indicated below to collective bargaining statewide (BUF
7 102) the following sums or so much thereof as may be necessary
8 to fund for fiscal biennium 2019-2021 all collective bargaining
9 cost items in the agreement negotiated with the exclusive
10 representative of collective bargaining unit (9):

10 who are excluded from collective bargaining assigned to the
11 Hawaii health systems corporation and belong to the same
12 compensation plans as those officers and employees within
13 bargaining unit (9):

16 SECTION 13. Funds appropriated by this part shall be
17 allotted by the director of finance to the Hawaii health systems
18 corporation for expenditure in the respective fiscal year for
19 the purposes of this part.

20 PART VII

1 SECTION 14. Salary increases and cost adjustments provided
2 in this Act for any officer or employee whose compensation is
3 paid, in whole or in part, from federal, special, or other funds
4 shall be paid wholly or proportionately, as the case may be,
5 from the respective funds.

6 SECTION 15. Funds appropriated or authorized by this Act
7 that are not expended or encumbered by June 30, 2021, shall
8 lapse as of that date.

9 SECTION 16. This Act shall take effect on January 1, 2050.
