
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE STATE SHRIMP.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Anchialine pools, also known as wai ‘ōpae, are
2 considered to be wahi pana, or culturally sacred, special
3 ecosystems in Hawaii. Of the seven hundred recorded anchialine
4 pools in Hawaii, over six hundred fifty pools are located in the
5 county of Hawaii, mostly in the districts of north and south
6 Kona and Ka‘ū.

7 The ‘ōpae ‘ula is a species of shrimp endemic to Hawaii's
8 anchialine pools. The population of ‘ōpae ‘ula is an important
9 indicator of the health of an anchialine pool. In healthy
10 anchialine pools, the population of ‘ōpae ‘ula is abundant.

11 The legislature finds that the designation of the ‘ōpae ‘ula
12 as the state shrimp will raise awareness of the ‘ōpae ‘ula and
13 support efforts to protect anchialine pool ecosystems throughout
14 the State as a natural resource. In designating the ‘ōpae ‘ula
15 as the state shrimp, the legislature does not intend to prevent

1 or impact the traditional and ongoing practice of harvesting
2 'ōpae to be used in 'ōpelu fishing.

3 SECTION 2. Chapter 5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended
4 by adding a new section to be appropriately designated and to
5 read as follows:

6 "§5- State shrimp. The 'ōpae 'ula (Halocaridina rubra),
7 also known as the red shrimp, is established and designated as
8 the official shrimp of the State."

9 SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.

10 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
