
HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION TO EXPAND ACCESS TO THE
WE THE PEOPLE PROGRAM FOR PUBLIC SCHOOL STUDENTS AND REPORT
TO THE LEGISLATURE ON THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE C3
FRAMEWORK FOR SOCIAL STUDIES IN PUBLIC SCHOOLS.

1 WHEREAS, Hawaii has the lowest voter turnout in the nation,
2 with only 52.6 percent of registered voters casting a ballot in
3 the 2018 general election; and

4
5 WHEREAS, civic education programs, such as We The People,
6 prepare students to participate in the political and public life
7 of their communities; and

8
9 WHEREAS, civic education teaches students to recognize
10 social problems, evaluate possible solutions, separate evidence-
11 based claims from opinions, and act upon what they learn; and

12
13 WHEREAS, in 2013, the National Council for Social Studies
14 published the College, Career, & Civic Life C3 Framework of
15 Social Studies; and

16
17 WHEREAS, the C3 Framework incorporates new paradigms
18 focusing on global perspectives, multicultural viewpoints,
19 democratic citizenship, connecting the past with the present,
20 collaborative learning and work environments, and applying
21 knowledge to the broader community; and

22
23 WHEREAS, in 2015, the Board of Education adopted the
24 College, Career, and Civic Life Framework for Social Studies
25 State Standards, or C3 Framework, to implement inquiry-based
26 learning and emphasize the application of knowledge to real-
27 world problems, issues, and concerns; and

1 WHEREAS, We The People advances the goals established under
 2 the C3 Framework for social studies, including increasing
 3 students' understanding of democratic responsibility and civic
 4 engagement; and

5
 6 WHEREAS, cultivating civic, social, and political
 7 engagement among students is one strategy to increase voter
 8 turnout over the long term; now, therefore,

9
 10 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the
 11 Thirtieth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of
 12 2020, the Senate concurring, that the Department of Education is
 13 requested to expand access to the We The People program for
 14 public school students; and

15
 16 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Education is
 17 requested to provide a report to the Legislature on the
 18 Department's implementation of the C3 Framework for social
 19 studies in public schools, including expanding access to the We
 20 The People program, no later than twenty days prior to the
 21 convening of the Regular Session of 2021; and

 23 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this
 24 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Chairperson of the
 25 Board of Education and Superintendent of the Department of
 26 Education.
