A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO LAY NETS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 188, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
3 and to read as follows:

4 "§188- Use of lay nets for fishing; prohibited. (a) It
5 is unlawful to possess or use on, in, or near state waters, a
6 lay net for the purpose of taking aquatic life, except under the
7 terms and conditions of a permit first obtained by the user from
8 the department. The department may issue permits for the
9 possession or use of lay nets consistent with other legal
10 requirements.

11 (b) For the purposes of this section, "lay net" means a
12 gill net that is deployed in the water in a specific location
13 and retrieved from the same location after a certain time period
14 has passed to allow for the capture of aquatic life."

15 SECTION 2. Section 188-70, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
16 amended to read as follows:



1 "§188-70 Penalties. (a) Any person violating any
2 provision of or any rule adopted pursuant to this chapter,
3 except sections 188-23 [and], 188-39.5, and 188- , is guilty of
4 a petty misdemeanor and, in addition to any other penalties,
5 shall be fined not less than:

- 6 (1) \$100 for a first offense;
- 7 (2) \$200 for a second offense; and
- 8 (3) \$500 for a third or subsequent offense.

9 (b) Any person violating section 188-23, is guilty of a
10 class C felony and shall be sentenced pursuant to chapter 706;
11 provided that the environmental court, in addition to any term
12 of imprisonment or any other terms and conditions of probation,
13 shall order the defendant to pay a fine of not less than \$1,000.
14 Notwithstanding section 706-669 and any other law to the
15 contrary, any person in violation of section 188-23(b), as a
16 first offense, shall be sentenced to a mandatory minimum period
17 of imprisonment without possibility of parole of thirty days.
18 Repeat offenders shall be sentenced pursuant to chapter 706.

19 (c) The environmental court may require the defendant to
20 complete an aquatic resources educational class administered by
21 the department of land and natural resources in addition to or



1 in lieu of paying all or any part of any monetary fine
2 authorized by this section.

3 (d) The environmental court may direct the defendant to
4 perform community service as administered by the department of
5 land and natural resources in lieu of paying any monetary fine
6 authorized by this section.


7 (e) Any person violating section 188- , is guilty of a
8 misdemeanor and shall be sentenced pursuant to chapter 706;
9 provided that an offender under section 188- shall be
10 sentenced to a mandatory minimum period of imprisonment of one
11 day."

12 SECTION 3. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
13 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
14 begun before its effective date.

15 SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
16 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

17 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
