

1 "Committee" means the access Hawaii committee.

2 "Government agency" means any government agency that
3 stores, gathers, ~~[or]~~ generates public information, or provides
4 services, including all branches of government, all executive
5 departments, boards, and commissions of the State or counties,
6 and all public corporations created by the legislature.

7 "Internet" means the global information system that is
8 logically linked together by a globally unique address space
9 based on the internet protocol (IP), or its subsequent
10 extension; and that is able to support communications using the
11 transmission control protocol/internet protocol (TCP/IP) suite,
12 or its subsequent extension, or other IP-compatible protocols;
13 and that provides, uses, or makes accessible, either publicly or
14 privately, information to users.

15 "Internet ~~[portal]~~ portals" or "portals" means the
16 centralized electronic information system by which public
17 information ~~[is]~~ and services are provided via ~~[dial-in modem or~~
18 ~~continuous link to the public through subscriptions.]~~ the
19 internet.

20 "Portal ~~[manager]~~ provider" means the ~~[entity]~~ entities or
21 ~~[person]~~ persons engaged to provide content or services and



1 manage [~~and operate the internet~~] or support activities on the
2 [~~internet portal on behalf of the State.~~] portals.

3 "Value added electronic services" means services, including
4 but not limited to:

- 5 (1) Providing periodic, continual, and ongoing access to
6 information maintained by a government agency without
7 requiring separate requests for information as it is
8 created;
- 9 (2) Compiling data or performing other research services;
- 10 (3) Permitting the electronic filing of reports, renewals,
11 or application; or
- 12 (4) Enabling the transaction of business over the internet
13 [~~portal.~~] portals.

14 ~~[§]§27G-2[§]~~ **Charges for services.** Any law to the
15 contrary notwithstanding, government agencies may charge for
16 value added electronic services provided through the [~~portal~~
17 ~~manager.~~] internet portals.

18 **§27G-3 Access Hawaii committee; establishment; membership;**
19 **chairperson.** (a) There is established within the department of
20 accounting and general services, the access Hawaii committee.



1 The provisions of section 26-34 shall not apply to the
2 committee.

3 (b) The committee shall consist of not more than fifteen
4 voting, ex officio members, or their designated representatives,
5 as follows:

- 6 (1) The comptroller;
- 7 (2) The administrator of the state procurement office;
- 8 (3) The director of the office of information practices;
- 9 (4) The directors of not more than three government
10 agencies selected by the governor using or planning to
11 use the services of the [~~portal manager,~~] internet
12 portals;
- 13 (5) The administrative director of the courts;
- 14 (6) A representative of the Hawaii state senate appointed
15 by the president of the senate;
- 16 (7) A representative of the Hawaii state house of
17 representatives appointed by the speaker of the house
18 of representatives;
- 19 (8) The chief information officers of the four counties;
20 [and]
- 21 (9) The chief information officer~~[-]~~; and



1 (10) One member to be appointed by the Disability and
2 Communication Access Board.

3 (c) The chief information officer or the chief information
4 officer's designee shall serve as the chairperson of the
5 committee.

6 ~~[+]~~ §27G-4 ~~[+]~~ **Duties of the committee.** The committee shall
7 provide oversight of the ~~[portal manager,]~~ internet portals,
8 including:

9 (1) Review of the annual strategic plan and periodic
10 reports on existing and potential new applications and
11 services submitted by the portal ~~[manager,]~~ providers
12 and agencies;

13 (2) Review and approval of all charges to portal users~~[,]~~,
14 except where other statutes set such fees;

15 (3) Review and approval of service ~~[level]~~ agreements
16 negotiated by government agencies ~~[with the portal~~
17 ~~manager,]~~ for services provided through the internet
18 portals;

19 (4) Review of the annual financial reports and audit of
20 the portal ~~[manager,]~~ providers;



- 1 (5) Review of annual customer satisfaction surveys
2 conducted by the portal [~~manager,~~] providers; and
3 (6) Review of performance measures of the portal
4 [~~submitted as part of the service management plan for~~
5 ~~portal wide indicators and application specific~~
6 ~~indicators.~~] providers.

7 **§27G-5 Annual report.** The committee shall submit an
8 annual report to the governor and the legislature, no later than
9 twenty days prior to the convening of each regular session, on
10 the operations of the [~~portal.~~] portals. The annual report
11 shall include the portal [~~manager's~~] providers' annual financial
12 reports[-] as related to operations of the portals.

13 **§27G-6 Access Hawaii committee special fund.** There is
14 established in the state treasury the access Hawaii committee
15 special fund, into which shall be deposited fees collected by
16 the office of enterprise technology services for the purpose of
17 supporting the access Hawaii committee. The chief information
18 officer may appoint a portal program manager exempt from chapter
19 76, which may be funded by the access Hawaii committee special
20 fund. Expenditures from the access Hawaii committee special
21 fund shall be approved by the access Hawaii committee; provided



1 that information on income and expenditures shall be subject to
2 legislative review and oversight in each budget submittal from
3 the department of accounting and general services."
