SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING THE GOVERNOR TO DECLARE THE LAST SATURDAY OF EVERY
OCTOBER AS A "DAY OF TRICK-OR-TREATING".

1 WHEREAS, Halloween is widely celebrated throughout the
2 State, regardless of religious, ethnic, or political
3 affiliation; and
4

5 WHEREAS, the Legislature is concerned for the safety and
6 well-being of its citizens, particularly its children; and
7

8 WHEREAS, Halloween is celebrated by "trick-or-treating," an
9 activity during which children walk or run to and among houses,
10 including in or across streets on which there are moving
11 vehicles; and
12

13 WHEREAS, trick-or-treating often occurs when it is dark;
14 and
15

16 WHEREAS, such darkness creates dangerous conditions for
17 both pedestrians and drivers; and
18

19 WHEREAS, a study published by the Journal of the American
20 Medical Association Pediatrics found that there are forty-three
21 percent more pedestrian fatalities on Halloween night than there
22 are on any other autumn night; and
23

24 WHEREAS, many parents, guardians, or caregivers of children
25 work, and cannot leave their place of employment during daylight
26 hours to supervise their children on Halloween; and
27

28 WHEREAS, declaring an additional day for the celebration of
29 Halloween does not change nor move the day of Halloween; and
30

31 WHEREAS, the day of Halloween is and will continue to be
32 October 31 of each year; now, therefore,

2 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirtieth Legislature
3 of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2020, the House of
4 Representatives concurring, that in the interest of public
5 safety, that the Governor is urged to declare the last Saturday
6 of October as a "Day of Trick-or-Treating"; and

8 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that in so declaring, the Governor
9 urges the residents of the State to participate in trick-or-
10 treating activities on the last Saturday of October; and

12 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a certified copy of this
13 Concurrent Resolution shall be sent to the Governor of the State
14 of Hawaii.
