SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

STRONGLY URGING THE UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF HOUSING AND
URBAN DEVELOPMENT AND THE UNITED STATES CONGRESS TO ALLOW
HAWAIIAN HOMESTEADS TO BE DIRECT RECIPIENTS OF FEDERAL
NATIVE HAWAIIAN HOUSING BLOCK GRANTS UNDER THE NATIVE
AMERICAN HOUSING ASSISTANCE AND SELF-DETERMINATION ACT.

1 WHEREAS, WHEREAS, the Native American Housing Assistance
2 and Self-Determination Act (NAHASDA) was passed in 1996 and
3 established a block grant program to transform the way American
4 Indians and Alaska Natives provided affordable housing on rural
5 Indian reservations and Alaska Native villages; and
6

7 WHEREAS, the United States Congress amended NAHASDA in 2000
8 by adding Title VIII to provide similar funding for Native
9 Hawaiian families whose total household income is at or below
10 eighty percent of the established area median income levels for
11 their respective counties, and who are eligible to reside on
12 Hawaiian home lands; and
13

14 WHEREAS, the stated objectives of the NAHASDA are to assist
15 native communities in achieving the goals of economic self-
16 sufficiency and self-determination, which should include
17 recognizing the special and independent nature of each Hawaiian
18 homestead; and
19

20 WHEREAS, the federal government's financial investment into
21 affordable housing activities in Hawaiian homestead communities
22 through the Native Hawaiian Housing Block Grant has been
23 steadily decreasing since its highest award of \$12,700,000 in
24 2010 to only \$2,000,000 in 2019, 2018, and 2017, with no federal
25 appropriations made in 2016; and

27 WHEREAS, Hawaii is experiencing a critical affordable
28 housing shortage and more funding, not less, is needed to
29 support infrastructure development, home construction and

1 rehabilitation programs, direct loans, and housing subsidies for
2 Native Hawaiian families; and

3

4 WHEREAS, the Department of Hawaiian Home Lands is the
5 designated recipient for the Native Hawaiian Housing Block Grant
6 as administered by the United States Department of Housing and
7 Urban Development; and

8

9 WHEREAS, designating individual Hawaiian homesteads in the
10 State of Hawaii to be direct recipients of Native Hawaiian
11 Housing Block Grants, in addition to the Department of Hawaiian
12 Home Lands, could expedite the effective utilization of these
13 funds and expand affordable housing opportunities for low-income
14 families and individuals living on, or desiring to live on
15 Hawaiian homesteads; now, therefore,

16

17 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirtieth Legislature
18 of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2020, the House of
19 Representatives concurring, that the United States Department of
20 Housing and Urban Development and the Congress of the United
21 States are strongly urged to provide additional federal funds
22 for Native Hawaiian Housing Block Grants under the Native
23 American Housing Assistance and Self-Determination Act; and

25 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the United States Department of
26 Housing and Urban Development and the Congress of the United
27 States are strongly urged to designate individual Hawaiian
28 homesteads as direct recipients of Native Hawaiian Housing Block
29 Grants; and

31 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the United States Department of
32 Housing and Urban Development and the Congress of the United
33 States are strongly urged to identify and secure other forms of
34 direct assistance to the State of Hawaii to address affordable
35 housing needs of the Native Hawaiian population; and

37 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this
38 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the President of the
39 United States, United States Secretary of Housing and Urban
40 Development, United States Secretary of the Interior, Majority
41 Leader of the United States Senate, Speaker of the United States
42 House of Representatives, Chairperson of the Hawaiian Homes


