SENATE RESOLUTION

OFFICIALLY RECOGNIZING THE SEVENTY-FIFTH ANNIVERSARY OF THE
UNITED NATIONS.

1 WHEREAS, in response to World War II and the resulting
2 divisiveness created around the globe, the United Nations was
3 established in 1945; and
4

5 WHEREAS, for seventy-five years the United Nations has been
6 dedicated to establishing the international standard for
7 multi-culturalism, international peace and security, human
8 rights, social and economic well-being, and sustainability; and
9

10 WHEREAS, on June 14, 2019, the United Nations General
11 Assembly adopted a resolution to commemorate the seventy-fifth
12 anniversary of the establishment of the United Nations under the
13 theme, "The future we want, the United Nations we need:
14 reaffirming our collective commitment to multilateralism", thus
15 encouraging input, conversation, constructive reflection, and
16 collective priority to raise awareness, and mobilization of
17 greater support to achieve the future we need; and

19 WHEREAS, the implementation of the Sustainable Development
20 Goals (SDGs), otherwise known as the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable
21 Development, born at the United Nations Conference in Rio de
22 Janeiro, requires cooperation across borders, sectors, and
23 generations; and

25 WHEREAS, Hawaii is in alignment with the goals of the
26 United Nations and committed to supporting the global campaigns
27 set forth for environmental sustainability and human welfare;
28 now, therefore,

30 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirtieth Legislature
31 of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2020, that the State
32 of Hawaii officially recognizes the seventy-fifth anniversary of
33 the United Nations; and

1 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that citizens of Hawaii are
2 encouraged to participate in activities commemorating the
3 milestone anniversary of the United Nations throughout 2020; and

5 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the United States Congress,
6 State of Hawaii, local public officials, and civic leaders are
7 respectfully urged to join in a concerted national effort to
8 support the principles and vital work of the United Nations; and

10 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that educational institutions and
11 local media are encouraged to highlight the importance of the
12 United Nations, its history, mission, accomplishments and goals;

15 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this
16 Resolution be transmitted to the Majority Leader of the United
17 States Senate; Speaker of the United States House of
18 Representatives; Hawaii's congressional delegation; Governor of
19 the State of Hawaii; Comptroller; Chairperson of the Board of
20 Agriculture; Attorney General; Director of Finance; Director of
21 Business, Economic Development, and Tourism; Director of
22 Commerce and Consumer Affairs; Adjutant General; Chairperson of
23 the Board of Education; Superintendent of Education; Chairperson
24 of the Hawaiian Homes Commission; Director of Health; Director
25 of Human Resources Development; Director of Human Services;
26 Director of Labor and Industrial Relations; Chairperson of the
27 Board of Land and Natural Resources; Director of Public Safety;
28 Director of Taxation; Director of Transportation; President of
29 the University of Hawaii System; Administrator of the State
30 Procurement Office; Mayor of the City and County of Honolulu;
31 Mayor of the County of Maui; Mayor of the County of Hawaii;
32 Mayor of the County of Kauai; Chairperson of the Honolulu City
33 Council; Chairperson of the Maui County Council; Chairperson of
34 the Hawaii County Council; Chairperson of the Kauai County
35 Council.
