SENATE RESOLUTION

URGING THE STATE TO BAN SINGLE-USE PLASTIC GOODS AND PLASTIC BAGS AND TO SET A SUSTAINABILITY EXAMPLE BY ELIMINATING THE USE OF SINGLE-USE PLASTIC TABLEWARE AT STATE DEPARTMENT MEETINGS AND FUNCTIONS.

1 WHEREAS, the impact of the world's waste stream is
2 unsustainable and detrimental to the future of Hawaii's
3 environment and people; and
4

5 WHEREAS, plastic goods and other carbon-based products
6 contribute to the environmental degradation of Hawai'i; and
7

8 WHEREAS, the State is obligated to act in the best interest
9 of the residents' health and welfare; and
10

11 WHEREAS, the reduction of the amount of plastic waste
12 directly improves the carbon-based waste stream of the State;
13 and
14

15 WHEREAS, Maui County and Hawaii County have already started
16 reducing the amount of plastic waste in the State by banning
17 polystyrene containers; and
18

19 WHEREAS, the Honolulu City Council recently passed a bill
20 banning most single-use plastic goods and bags; and
21

22 WHEREAS, the State is committed to significantly reduce its
23 waste production and eliminate carbon-based single-use plastics
24 by 2030; and

26 WHEREAS, the attendees of the 26th Annual Children and
27 Youth Summit voted that the reduction of single-use plastic in
28 the State is a priority concern that needs to be addressed; now,
29 therefore,

31 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirtieth Legislature
32 of the State of Hawai'i, Regular Session of 2020, that the State
33 is urged to ban the use of single-use plastic goods and plastic

1 bags according to the same standards set forth in Bill 40, as
2 passed by the Honolulu City Council in 2019; and

4 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the State is urged to set a
5 sustainability example by eliminating the use of single-use
6 plastic tableware at all state department meetings and
7 functions; and

9 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this
10 Resolution be transmitted to the Governor; Comptroller;
11 Chairperson of the Board of Agriculture; Attorney General;
12 Director of Finance; Director of Business, Economic Development,
13 and Tourism; Director of Commerce and Consumer Affairs; Adjutant
14 General; Superintendent of Education; Chairperson of the
15 Hawaiian Homes Commission; Director of Human Resources
16 Development; Director of Human Services; Director of Labor and
17 Industrial Relations; Chairperson of the Board of Land and
18 Natural Resources; Director of Public Safety; Director of
19 Taxation; and Director of Transportation.
