(HSCR1084-20)
Status

RELATING TO PROFESSIONAL AND VOCATIONAL
LICENSING TRUST FUNDS.

IAC, CPC, FIN

Allows the contractors license board and real estate commission to adjust, reduce, suspend, or cease collection of recovery fund and education fund fees to maintain a reasonable relation between the fees generated and the cost of services rendered by the funds. Caps the contractors recovery fund, contractors education fund, real estate recovery fund, real estate education fund, and condominium education trust fund at amounts determined biannually by the contractors license board or real estate commission. Effective 7/1/2050. (HD1)

(HSCR1083-20)
Status

RELATING TO MASSAGE THERAPY.

IAC, CPC, FIN

Requires the Board of Massage Therapy to adopt and enforce sanitation rules for massage establishments. Repeals existing statutory language that classifies unlicensed activity as a petty misdemeanor in favor of existing statutes that treat unlicensed activity as a misdemeanor. Increases the minimum fine from \$100 to \$250 and the maximum fine from \$1,000 to \$2,000 for each violation of the massage therapy laws. Effective 7/1/2050. (HD1)



<u>SB 2877, SD1, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR1085-20)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO MENTAL HEALTH COUNSELORS. Clarifies that the practicum internship experience requirement is to be included with the course work in counseling requirement for mental health counselors. Permits applicants to fulfill all or part of their face-to-face clinical supervision requirement by a videoconference service. Effective 7/1/2050. (HD1)	IAC, CPC, FIN
<u>SB 2424, SD1, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR1070-20)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE PRACTICE OF MEDICINE. Clarifies the definition of the practice of medicine to provide uniformity of practice for both medical physicians and osteopathic physicians. Effective 7/1/2050. (HD1)	HLT/IAC, CPC, FIN
<u>SB 2120</u> <u>(SSCR2970)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO GIFT CERTIFICATES. Clarifies that certain county-issued cards and certificates are not subject to the State's unfair and deceptive practices regulations related to gift certificates.	CPC, FIN
<u>SB 2130, SD1</u> <u>(SSCR2995)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE STATE FIRE CODE. Amends the process for adoption of the state fire code to conform with other Hawaii state building codes. (SD1)	CPC, JUD
<u>SB 2281, SD1, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR1093-20)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO BEHAVIOR ANALYSTS. Makes permanent the regulation of behavior analysts. Exempts the behavior analysts licensing program from the auditor's evaluation requirement. Effective 7/1/2050. (HD1)	HLT, CPC, FIN
<u>SB 3008, SD1, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR1053-20)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO MEASUREMENT STANDARDS. Exempts hydrogen fuels from measurement requirements of petroleum products. Effective 7/1/2050. (HD1)	EEP, CPC, FIN
<u>SB 2881</u> <u>(SSCR2948)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE PEER REVIEW OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE. Clarifies the role of the Board of Public Accountancy in selecting members to serve on the Board's Peer Review Oversight Committee.	CPC, FIN

DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW

Persons wishing to offer comments should submit testimony at least 24 hours prior to the hearing. Testimony should indicate:

- Testifier's name with position/title and organization;
- The Committee(s) to which the comments are directed;
- The date and time of the hearing; and
