<u>SB 2775</u> (SSCR2630) <u>Status & Testimony</u>	RELATING TO THE FUEL TANK ADVISORY COMMITTEE. Requires the fuel tank advisory committee to meet twice within a same calendar year at least six months apart.	AEN, CPH
<u>SB 2727, SD1</u> (SSCR2461) <u>Status & Testimony</u>	RELATING TO DEPOSIT BEVERAGE CONTAINERS. Exempts a beverage dealer who is located in a high density population area from operating a redemption center if the dealer is located within 1 mile of a certified redemption center operated independently of the dealer. Takes effect 7/1/2023. (SD1)	AEN, CPH
<u>SB 2649</u> (SSCR2345) <u>Status & Testimony</u>	RELATING TO TOUR AIRCRAFT. Amends section 261-12 to require tour aircraft operations permit seekers to have aircraft which are outfitted with FAA approved safety devices.	TRS, CPH
<u>SB 2474, SD1</u> (SSCR2514) <u>Status & Testimony</u>	RELATING TO LITTLE FIRE ANTS. Authorizes the Department of Agriculture to identify best practices for the treatment of little fire ants in conjunction with the Hawaii Ant Lab. Requires the Department of Agriculture to post on its website best practices for the treatment of little fire ants. Allows the Pest Control Board to revoke, suspend, or refuse to renew any license for violation of any best practice identified by the Department of Agriculture. (SD1)	AEN, CPH
<u>SB 2750</u> (SSCR2451) <u>Status & Testimony</u>	RELATING TO BOTTLED WATER. Repeals the requirement that noncarbonated bottled water be transported, stored, processed, or bottled through lines or equipment through which only water is passed.	AEN, CPH
<u>SB 2774, SD1</u> (SSCR2601) <u>Status & Testimony</u>	RELATING TO UNDERGROUND STORAGE TANKS. Prohibits, beginning 1/1/2028, a person to operate an underground storage system with a capacity of 100,000 gallons or more, mauka of the underground injection control line. <p>SB 2532, SD1 (SSCR2635) Status & Testimony</p>	<p>RELATING TO COMPOSTING. Establishes a class of artisan-scale composting operations exempt from department of health regulations to divert organic materials from Hawaii's landfills. (SD1)</p>	<p>AEN/WTL, CPH</p>
<p>SB 2724 (SSCR2515) Status & Testimony</p>	<p>RELATING TO LEAD-BASED PAINT. Prohibits the use of lead-based paint on outdoor structures after 12/31/21.</p>	<p>AEN, CPH</p>
<p>SB 2120 (SSCR2314) Status & Testimony</p>	<p>RELATING TO GIFT CERTIFICATES. Clarifies that certain county-issued cards and certificates are not subject to the State's unfair and deceptive practices regulations related to gift certificates.</p>	<p>PSM, CPH</p>
<p>SB 2336, SD1 (SSCR2443) Status & Testimony</p>	<p>RELATING TO LONG-TERM CARE INSURANCE. Requires the thirty-day lapse or termination notices for long-term care policies to be sent by certified mail, priority mail, or commercial delivery service, or other method of delivery requiring proof of delivery. (SD1)</p>	<p>HMS, CPH</p>
<p>SB 2432, SD1 (SSCR2517) Status & Testimony</p>	<p>RELATING TO CABLE TELEVISION. Amends the factors the director of commerce and consumer affairs must consider when determining whether cable service should be made available upon a new application of a cable franchise. Requires that the director require cable operators to provide cable service to residences in their service area where there is a minimum density of at least twenty-five homes per linear mile, with certain exceptions. <p>SB 2561 (SSCR2471) Status & Testimony</p>	<p>RELATING TO CONSUMER PROTECTION. Requires retailers of household appliances to conspicuously display available energy efficiency rebates and state-specific energy operation costs. Effective 10/1/2020.</p>	<p>EET, CPH</p>
<p>SB 2975, SD1 (SSCR2787) Status & Testimony</p>	<p>RELATING TO INTOXICATING LIQUOR. Exempts applications for a class 1 license on land designated as agricultural by state or county zoning laws and for which the majority of the agricultural commodities used in the manufacturing of the liquor are grown and produced in the State by the license holder from the automatic refusal provision that may be invoked by a majority of nearby voters or real estate owners. (SD1)</p>	<p>AEN, CPH</p>
<p>SB 2817, SD1 (SSCR2460) Status & Testimony</p>	<p>RELATING TO WASTE. Requires cooperative housing corporations and unit owners' associations of high-rise condominium properties to provide at least one waste cooking oil receptacle in an easily accessible location on the property to allow residents to deposit grease and waste cooking oil. (SD1)</p>	<p>AEN, CPH</p>
<p>SB 2961, SD1 (SSCR2888) Status & Testimony</p>	<p>RELATING TO WAGES. Makes general contractors entering into or under contracts in the State for work on buildings, structures, or other private works liable for debt incurred by subcontractors for wages due to claimants for performance of labor in the contract between the general contractor and owner. Effective 7/1/51. (SD1)</p>	<p>LCA, CPH</p>

<p>SB 2805, SD1 (SSCR2551) Status & Testimony</p>	<p>RELATING TO THE OFFICE OF PLANNING. Requires the office of planning to prepare a comprehensive renewable energy siting plan. Requires report to the legislature. (SD1)</p>	<p>WTL/EET, CPH</p>
<p>SB 2808 (SSCR2507) Status & Testimony</p>	<p>RELATING TO TRANSPORTATION NETWORK COMPANIES. Establishes rules, regulations, and permitting procedures for transportation network companies operating in the State. Makes permanent insurance requirements for transportation network companies and transportation network drivers.</p>	<p>TRS, CPH</p>
<p>SB 2955 (SSCR2800) Status & Testimony</p>	<p>RELATING TO COFFEE LABELING. Expands the coffee labeling and advertising requirements to include ready-to-drink coffee beverages and inner wrapping or packaging labels. Effective 7/1/2021.</p>	<p>AEN, CPH</p>
<p>SB 3008, SD1 (SSCR2696) Status & Testimony</p>	<p>RELATING TO MEASUREMENT STANDARDS. Exempts hydrogen fuels from measurement requirements of petroleum products. (SD1)</p>	<p>EET, CPH</p>
