<u>HB 1685</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO TAXATION. Establishes an income tax credit for investment in qualified businesses that develop cybersecurity and artificial intelligence.	EDB, FIN
<u>HB 2551</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE DEPARTMENT OF BUSINESS, ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT, AND TOURISM. Makes an appropriation for operating expenses of DBEDT.	EDB, FIN
<u>HB 2404, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR143-20)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO GRANTS FOR LOCAL RECYCLING FACILITIES. Requires the office of solid waste management to establish the recycled products manufacturing grant program to incentivize new recycled products manufacturing, bioconversion, or composting business within the State. Appropriates funds. Effective 7/1/2050. (HD1)	EEP, EDB, FIN
<u>HB 1850, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR8-20)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE ENERGY SECURITY SPECIAL FUND. Allows the chief energy officer to contract with Hawaii not-for-profit entities to administer expenditures from the energy security special fund for the purposes set forth in section 201-12.8, HRS. Increases the allocation from the state environmental response, energy, and food security tax for deposit to the energy security special fund from 5 cents to 15 cents per barrel or fractional part of a barrel of petroleum product. Effective 7/1/2050. (HD1)	EEP, EDB, FIN

Submit testimony in ONE of the following ways:


